1 – 4	1 – 8	Couple 1 face partner. They will cross across the set with 4 side-polka steps. They begin face-to-face and on the hop will turn to dance back-to-back, turn and dance face-to-face and again back-to-back. At the same time, in social dance position, Couple 2 will chassee across for 8 counts, passing between Couple 1.
5 – 8	9 -16	Dancers will then return to place with the same steps but Couple 1 begins back-to-back. Couple 2 is dancing the 8 counts of chassee.
9 – 16	17 – 32	Repeat measures $1-8$ except that Couple 2 will do the face-to-face, etc. and Couple 1 will dance the chassee steps.

1 – 2	1 - 4	All couples in social dance position present themselves to the opposite couple using 4 chassee steps.
3 - 4	5 - 8	Chassee back to place.
5 - 8	9 – 16	Swing partner.
9 -12	17 - 24	W dance a Right hand star with 4 two-steps.
13 – 16	25 – 32	W dance a Left hand star back to place. As the W arrives she gives her L hand to the M who turns her under the joined hands to place.
