## St. John River

Origin: Canada Source: Jessie Bryden Choreography: Prudence Edwards This dance was the winner of the multicultural dance competition held in 1966 to find a dance that would be Canada's Centennial Dance. It represents the flowing of the St. John River across the countryside of New Brunswick.

<u>Step</u>: Strathspey

Formation: 4 couples in a longways set

- Measures: Pattern: Introduction: 1 chord
- 1-8 1<sup>st</sup> Woman, followed by her partner, casts off (R) behind 2<sup>nd</sup> W, crosses the set and casts behind 3<sup>rd</sup> M, crosses the set and casts behind 4<sup>th</sup> W to finish below 4<sup>th</sup> couple. Couple 1 will finish improper facing up the set. This figure represents the meandering of the river across the countryside. When 1<sup>st</sup> couple begin the cast around 4<sup>th</sup> W, the 4<sup>th</sup> couple will raise their arms to represent a drawbridge on the river.
- 9-16 1<sup>st</sup> couple with nearer hands joined at shoulder height dance up under the arch formed by the 4<sup>th</sup> couple. While between the 3<sup>rd</sup> couple they face each other, join both hands and turn 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> CW. This turn represents the whirlpools. At the beginning of this turn, the 4<sup>th</sup> couple lower their raised hands. At the end of the turn, the 2<sup>nd</sup> couple raise their arms to form an arch to represent another bridge. 1<sup>st</sup> couple dances up to place.
- 17 24 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> couples turn to face couple 1. Lead by couple 1 they all dance up to 1<sup>st</sup> couple's position and dance down the middle of the set. (4 strathspey steps.) The 4<sup>th</sup> couple will not dance down the centre but when they reach the top of the set will acknowledge their partner and then cast off to dance down to return to place, other couples turning and leading up the set following 4<sup>th</sup> couple until all couples are back in place. This figure represents the reversing falls.
- 25 28 All four couples dance back-to-back (dos-a-dos). This represents the agitation of the water as it comes over the falls.

## St. John River – cont'd

29-32 1<sup>st</sup> couple faces down their own side of the set and dances a chain down the set. Change with 2<sup>nd</sup> couple by R hands, with 3<sup>rd</sup> couple by L hands and with 4<sup>th</sup> couple by R hands. Each couple has now moved up one position and the 1<sup>st</sup> couple end in 4<sup>th</sup> position. This figure represents the river wending its way to the sea.

Repeat with new couple.

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
