Our thanks to Mr Donald French for his enthusiasm and we hope that he will be able to co-operate with us on future occasions.

On Saturday, December 8th, we went to the Russian Relief Association at St Mary Abbots Hall, Kensington. It was from these people that we were able to borrow the Russian costumes used at the Albert Hall. As most of you know, Dr Cyriax made copies of the borrowed costumes for the Society. We now possess six male Russian costumes complete with boots. We did an ambitious programme of 22 dances, including Vo Sadu, Hopak, Krakowiak and Vava Vadmal. Our audience was extremely appreciative, and warmly hospitable, and we all enjoyed our evening very much indeed. Our very strenuous part of the programme was followed by ballroom dancing - to the Krakowiak music and a ballroom version of Karapet - all very interesting.

I should like to thank the seventeen members of the demonstration team who took part.
