On the sleeve of a record of Court Dances of Medieval France is quoted another piece of advice from one of the Dancing Masters, Arbeau: "... when you dance in company never look down at your feet to see whether you are performing the steps correctly. Keep your head and body erect and appear self-possessed. Spit and blow your nose sparingly, or if needs must turn your head away and use a fair white handkerchief. Converse affably in a low, modest voice, your hands at your sides, neither hanging limp nor moving nervously. Be suitably and neatly dressed, your hose well secured and your shoes clean"

"SELPAR" DEMONSTRATIONS

In October, the group was invited to Marston Green to give a full evening's entertainment of mixed international dances. It was a beautiful hall to dance in, though rather lofty, and we gave a programme of some 22 dances with audience participation in two of them, enjoyed by everyone.

Then we were asked to be the main attraction at an International Festival of the Sparkhill Council of Churches. This entailed two "spots" of 15 minutes each, and we were able to show Israeli and circle dances in Israeli costumes, then changed during the "Comedian and Ventriloquist" act to show mixed costumes and a greater variety of dances. Again, we included the audience in an item. In this very mixed community the organizers had also produced European, Asian and West Indian refreshments. Then, a steel band. It's quite amazing how well a slow Greek dance can fit into a Rumba rhythm!! A most enjoyable evening for us all and a happy get-together for the community.

On 16th and 17th November 12 members of Selpar, splendidly dressed, showed their paces in Birmingham Central Hall in two evenings of demonstration given by all Movement & Dance Groups affiliated to the West Midlands Sports Council. In amongst the Margaret Morris ladies and the Women's League of Health & Beauty, Junior Gymnasts and College Laban studies, appeared Scottish dancers, Morris dancers, Irish dancers (one girl was everyone's idea of the fairy at the bottom of the garden - an absolute delight) and, of course, international dancers, in Polish, Hungarian, Austrian and Swedish costumes - a colourful bunch and much admired by other teams. There weren't so many there on the first evening - about 1,200. (What could compete with Italy v England on television?), but many more for the second evening. It was good to see so many there; the last similar occasion was the night of the Birmingham bomb disasters. However, that's in the past and all was lighthearted and enjoyable.

Selpar danced in with Little Man in a Fix, continued into Kreuz Konig, Kapuvari Csardas, and danced away to Kuma Echa and much applause. The "Family Hunt" were welcomed very warmly by the announcer, and so they should be; Austrian father, Basque son, Austrian daughter and Ukrainian mother (costumes, of course) with accordion, violin and tambourine. Our thanks must go to Dennis for his hard work and family enthusiasm.

SOME IMPRESSIONS

I was not able to attend the afternoon course of Polish dances on December 3rd and I even managed to arrive late at the evening party. Had I arrived earlier, however, I would have missed the colourful impression, viewed through the window from the outside, of a room full of dancers in varied and beautiful costumes. To a folk dancer it was a lovely sight and I am told that many passers-by were seen to be looking in interestedly during the evening. I was disappointed a week later when I arrived at the Balkan Party, late again, to find that the curtains were all closed.

Another memorable moment at the Polish party was the sight of fourteen couples dancing Krakowiak immediately followed by a further 14 as there was not room for everyone who wanted to dance to do so in one 'sitting'. A few Finnish dances were included in the evening's programme, brought home from the Edinburgh Course (plus the showing of some excellent films by friends from Edinburgh) but otherwise the evening's dancing was entirely Polish. Personally I would like to see more so-called 'specialist' dances included in general dance programmes, such as Sunday Night at C.S.H., as well as more 'new' dances learned at day courses and Summer Schools. I am sure that dancers who come only to social dances must sometimes, like me, get just a little tired of always dancing all the 'old favourites'. I don't think a teaching session would be necessary, which is what many fear would happen - a quick demonstration by couples who know the dance and whom others could follow would be sufficient and, provided the dances were introduced often enough, dancers would soon pick them up and they too would become old favourites. Another facet of social dances I would like to see revived is the wearing of costume generally. I am told this was always a part of Sunday night dances once upon a time. Nowadays only a few M.C.s (notably Margery and 'Steve') wear costume and some of the rest of us at the New Year's Dance. And on the subject of New Year, a happy one to everyone!
