"OLE ESPANA", read the notice at Stoke Newington Assembly Hall in North-East London, - a most unlikely place to find a Spanish fiesta. The dancers, the notice went on to say, were to be led by no less than MANOLO, the celebrated Spanish Flamenco dancer.

A few people arrived outside the Assembly Hall some forty minutes before opening time, to be joined gradually and at more and more frequent intervals by others, eager to rush in to take the best seats with their free tickets (all the concerts are free in Hackney).

The atmosphere in the hall was cold, and the decor rather dusty and shabby. People shuffled around to find the best positions, and became rather noisy as they waited for the curtain to go up.

The programme, a folded duplicated sheet, gave no details of the names of the dances we were to see, but bore the names of the dancers - Castilian names, Valencian names, Andalucian names - conjuring up pictures of groups of fiery dancers from bodegas and tavernas.

Some twanging of guitar strings being adjusted, clatter of castanets being tried out, and then the curtain rose, to discover a line of seated dancers - seven girls, two men, plus the celebrated MANOLO, a group of guitarists and three singers. There was little in the way of "props" but they were not needed as the colours of the costumes were vivid and, indeed, garish, shouting to be admired. All the dancers rose from their seats to take up their position for Sevillanas, to open the Show; then, one after the other, the girls and men each got up in turn to perform their solo items. The musicians were excellent, as were the singers, but at first the atmosphere was rather dead and the pace slow and not very inspiring. Then Manolo took the stage and danced superbly. It was getting more exciting.

Then, gradually, the dancers began to get the feel of the show; the audience was totally attentive, the pace quickened, and by the time the interval came they were really captured by this talented group.

In the second half, the dancers really let their hair down (literally in some cases) and Manolo excelled himself in his leaps and turns, and controlled zapateado. All the girls were good in their execution of steps, hand movements, castanet playing, and interpretation of the music; some were even better than the others; one girl was outstanding and it was she and Manolo who, dancing together, provided the climax, which really was Spanish dancing at its best. The musicians and singers provided expert accompaniment, and the whole Show was a resounding success.

It really didn't matter that the dancers were, in fact, English, and that during the daytime they were secretaries, clerks, and Manolo an East-End barrow-boy, for on stage they really do become - MANOLO, the celebrated Spanish flamenco dancer, and his Company.
