SECRETARY'S NOTES

The February Committee Meeting dealt mostly with routine matters, but I must draw your attention to some changes in ur dates. The first Sunday in April falls on Easter Sunday; therefore our monthly Dance at Cecil Sharp House will be on 13th April, and for the same reason the Friday evening at the Chequer Centre has been changed to the 11th instead of the 4th April, which is Good Friday. In May, the first Sunday is also a Bank Holiday weekend; therefore the May Sunday Dance will be on the 11th and the Friday evening class at Chequer Centre will be on the 9th.
