### WEEKENDS AWAY

We hope to enclose with this issue of SIFD NEWS (if it is ready in time) the booking form for next year's programme of "Weekends Away", so perhaps some idea of what to expect will interest those who have never been on an SIFD weekend but have wondered about them.

These weekends are a good way to meet other members and also enjoy some dancing. Last year over one hundred application forms were received, and, the weekend at Easthampstead Park excepted, not more than fifty-seven members applied to go on any one weekend. As most of the houses we use accommodate about forty residents, it can be seen that there is a variety of choice for members. There is usually a waiting list, but in the end few people are disappointed.

Most applications come from London, the Home Counties and Southern England, which does influence and explain the choice of venues - the time and cost of travelling being significant. The accommodation available primarily depends upon the age of the house. Some have modern purpose-built study bedrooms, most have double rooms, whilst others have a few large bedrooms but nowadays one is not often asked to share with more than two others. The arrangement of the accommodation for each house is stated on the booking form.

Cost is an important factor, and for next year's programme, the cost is likely to be between £26 and £36 inclusive for the full weekend from Friday dinner to Sunday afternoon tea. This, I believe, compares favourably with the cost of residential weekends arranged by other organizations.

What of the dancing? Well, the evening Social Dances often continue until around midnight, and over the weekend about 100 dances from, say, fifteen different countries may be danced, mainly to live music by Caroline Thomas or Wilf Horrocks. The programme is likely to be a mixture of line, couple, set and circle dances, suited to the balance of the sexes and the interests of those dancing.

During the day, other activities are arranged, sometimes dance tuition, but walking in the countryside and outings to places of interest are popular, but if the weather is wet or very warm, some members just relax.

A weekend offers the opportunity to do as much or as little as one wishes, usually in very pleasant surroundings, with plenty of dancing available in a friendly and relaxed atmosphere, which I hope makes the SIFD mean more to those going than it would otherwise have done. So, if you have never been away for a weekend with the SIFD, why not do so this year? The form is there; complete and post it NOW.

# FOLK DANCE INSTRUMENT - DAIRE, DEF (TAMBURIN)

In some parts of Yugoslavia - Bosnia, Macedonia and South Serbia, def or daire is very often used. This is a frame drum with jingling rings all around the frame. The only difference between def and daire is in the jingling rings; def has convex and daire has flat jingling rings. The instrument is mostly used without the accompaniment of other musical instruments, for the marking of the rhythm.

There are two kinds of beating; in the middle of the skin, or near the frame. If the beating is in the middle of the skin, this sound is called "dum", and if it is near the frame, the sound is called "tek". From the dynamic point of view it corresponds to the intensity of forte-pianissimo (dum-tek).

It is considered that daire came to Yugoslavia from the Near East where the Oriental girl-dancers exhibit their physical charms to the accompaniment of the rhythm of this instrument. Also in Yugoslavia daire is the instrument mostly used by women (very seldon by men) performing various changes of complicated rhythm during the dances, some of which reflect the inherited Oriental influence.
