### SECRETARY'S NOTES

Owing to wad weather, the January Committee Meeting was cancelled. However, the newly elected Committee is as follows:

I hope that we will be able to meet on February 3rd.

I have sent copies of the CCPR Golden Jubilee leaflets to group leaders so that bookings for the Show may be made in good time. If further leaflets are required please let me know as soon as possible.

The SIFD have been invited to participate in the Eastbourne International Folk Festival this year. Details will be given at a later date.

Many members are used to going to the Folk Festival at the Royal Albert Hall in February each year. This is not, however, taking place this year and a restructured show "Folk Entertains" will take place at the Dominion Theatre, Tottenham Court Road, London, W.l. on May 11th at 2.30 p.m. and 7.30 p.m. As well as a variety of English folk performers there will be Irish Dancing from Clan Na Gael, Scottish Dancing from the Royal Scottish Country Dance Society, and music, song and dance from the Ukraine from a group called Veselka. Details from me or from Cecil Sharp House direct.

I have received a letter from the Greater London Council signed by the Chairman of the Arts and Recreation Committee and also by the leading Opposition Spokesman (i.e. both major political parties) expressing their concern about the consequences for sport and recreation in the event of the abolotion of the GLC and the six Metropolitan County Councils. They point out that there has not been a Government paper outlining its proposals for sport and recreation in the event of abolotion and at the public meeting called by the Central Council for Physical Recreation (CCPR) the Government declined an invitation to attend. The GLC alone spends about 41 million pounds a year on recreational facilities and it is unlikely that the London Boroughs on whom responsibility will devolve will be able to approach anything like this figure. The letter points out that the Government's proposals constitute an attack on sport and recreation which will diminish the quality of life in this country. It calls upon the Government to reassure the millions of people who take part in sport and recreation all over the country that it will not cause any further reduction in the already inadequate funding of sport and recreation. This could affect us, the SIFD; in many subtle ways: no Dunav concerts at the Royal Festival Hall, and no summer dancing in Battersea Park (and no doubt similar restrictions will occur in Birmingham, Manchester, etc.). If you share the letter writers! disquiet about this issue, they would like you to make your views known to your Member of Parliament.

Lily outlined the problem in the December SIFD NEWS and the main aims of the sub-committee are:

- (a) To find acceptable ways of reducing the amount of laborious work that goes into printing and distributing the SIFD NEWS.
- (b) To make the best use of any changes in the method of producing the SIFD NEWS to make it more interesting and effective.

The amount of paper that goes into one issue of the NEWS is impressive - about a third of a hundredweight. After printing, it all has to be collated, stapled, folded, stuffed into envelopes, which themselves need to be addressed and stamped - and sometimes there are extras to go in. Doug says that when the motorised duplicating machine is running well the printing only requires just over two hours work; it is the rest that takes the time as it is all done by hand. (Michael and Edwina agree; they print the envelopes with a hand machine.)

As Will Green points out in the January SIFD NEWS, cost is a vital consideration. In the past, various ways have been tried to spread the load: such as assembling the NEWS at the Friday Class, or groups getting together to do it in a member's home. This is very difficult to do year in year out, particularly as the whole operation from the deadline on the 15th of the month to putting it in the post on the 30th doesn't allow for much slippage.

Members with a special fund of knowledge, such as where to get printing, collating, envelope stuffing, etc. done more cheaply/efficiently, or who have solved a similar problem for some other society, should contact one of the sub-committee members.
