CCPR NEWS

On 6th February, I attended the Meeting of the CCPR Movement and Dance Division and the fellowing points arose which will interest members of the SIFD:

- 1. There is now available a register of teachers who work with people with disabilities, with a foreword by Lady Hamilton, the Chairman of the Disabled Living Foundation. Interested people should contact the CCFR at Francis House, Francis Street, London, SWIP 1DE.
- 2. Paddington College are to hold a City & Guilds 730 Course for Movement and Dance Teachers, starting in September 1985. The classes will be held on Wednesdays from 3 pm to 8 pm. Contact, Mr. A. - 3. The question of loss of facilities for sport and recreation was raised and I do ask again that any of our members who know of proposed closures of halls for classes etc. to protest most strongly to the Authority concerned and to their M.P. I will be writing to Mr. McFarlane, Minister for Sport, and to the Shadow Minister, but the more letters that are written the more notice will be taken.
- 4. Nibs Matthews of EFDSS gave a report on the progress of the forthcoming CCPR Golden Jubilee Show. BBC Personality, Judith Chalmers, has agreed to be the announcer and a souvenir programme will be on sale. It is hoped that Channel 4 will make a Video film of the show. Unfortunately, neither the Patron of CCPR, H.M. The Queen, nor the President, The Duke of Edinburgh, will be able to attend, due to other duties, but it is hoped that another eminent Personality will be able to attend.

SITUATION VACANT

** As there are a limited number of dances and most are generally well-known, the course will be shorter than usual and the fee accordingly less. However, we have received the original notes of LA DANZA, one of the compulsory dances, which reveal some small but significant differences from the current version. It is hoped there will also be time to introduce a new dance from Sicily.

CCPR GOLDEN JUBILEE

Many thanks to all the dancers and musicians who braved the bad road conditions to attend the dress rehearsal on February 10th. Thanks also to the reserves who filled in for the West Midlands Trios who were unfortunately snowed in.

Amendments to the dances:-

- a) Add final 'ho pa' to Zeeuwse Rei.
- b) The working Trios were alternated as proposed in the 'Amended Notes after 9th December Rehearsal' in La Bourree a Six de Briantes.
- c) In <u>Troika</u>, Rainmakers 19, Central London 9, Canons 13, Merton Park 3, Merton Park 4, Central London 7, Central London 10, West Midlands 18, form an inner circle which faces in the opposite direction to the normal line of dance (Inner Circle faces clockwise). The people in the inner circle dance the rest of the movements as before, keeping the inside lady going under the arch first and the baskets in the same direction. On Second time through Troika, the Outer circle dances off as planned whilst the inner circle continues to start the dance again until they reach the 'arches' part. Instead of 'arches' they dance off following Frank's Trio (Central London) or Pete's Trio (Merton Park), in single file with the inside lady dropping back, as in the outer circle. Exits are same ones as Entrances A, B, E E, F F F. Please 'pick-up' your feet as you run.

Extra Rehearsal: March 9th at Cecil Sharp House 3.00 - 5.00 p.m. (following the Italian Day Course). This is not a dress rehearsal. This will be the <u>last</u> rehearsal before the 'big day' so please make a great effort to attend, and please bring reserves to cover for absentees.
