SECRETARY'S NOTES

Sunday, 4th February, saw our return to Cecil Sharp House, both for Committee Meetings and the monthly Dance. It was marked by the first use of the Roly Minton memorial cashbox. Many members expressed appreciation of its engraved plate ensuring that Roly will be constantly remembered.

At the Committee Meeting preceding the Dance, four points arose which will be of interest to members:

We have at last heard from the Sidmouth International Folk Festival organizers, declining our offer of workshops this year. This will disappoint many people who look forward to meeting and dancing with old friends, both in the Drill Hall and at various open—air venues.

We are setting up two new Sub-Committees - a Video Sub-Committee whose members have expertise in video-ing, and a Cassette Sub-Committee who will take responsibility for getting the next two cassettes (C7 and C8) on the market as soon as possible.

In answer to queries from some members, we must make it clear that our insurance does <u>not</u> cover loss of equipment, costumes or sales stocks left in unattended vehicles. The cost of providing cover for such losses is quite prohibitive.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Lily,

After repeated rumours of his imminent departure, Narendra Kotiyan finally left for India on 3rd February. He has returned to Bombay with his sister and mother after more than thirty years as one of the main driving forces of the folk dance and music movement in London. Without making this sound like an obituary, I feel we should not let him leave without a salute to his considerable talents and achievements.

Frances Horrocks tells me that Naren was wearing a kilt when she first met him, but that it took little persuasion for him to turn towards international folk dancing. He had a happy period performing Russian, Spanish and French dances before finding his niche in Balkan dance and music. His warm, generous, outgoing nature has made him many friends here and abroad, from the enthusiastic beginner to the most eminent folklorist, musician or dancer.

To list some of Naren's contributions over the years we must take a deep breath and mention his achievements as a popular teacher of dance; the most versatile member of the Dunav Balkan Group (on tapan, tarabuka, kaval, gajda, zurna, frula, tamburitsa and bass); a creative producer of Balkan festivals; a co-founder of Balkanplus; a judge at the Llangollen Eisteddfod; and a delegate at various folklore conferences. Above all, he has been an untiring champion of folklore in the profoundest sense of the word. Naren has been the first to help and encourage us to attain higher standards, while insisting that we retain a proper sense of humility towards our chosen activity.

Naren will doubtless visit England from time to time. Many of us hope that he will eventually see fit to return permanently to England, where he is seen to be truly irreplaceable.

DANCE STUDIES, VOL.12, EDITED BY RODERYK LANGE

"The Dance Folklore from Cuiavia", a new book, price £5 plus p. & p. from Centre for Dance Studies, Les Bois, St.Peter, Jersey, Channel Islands.

At the beginning of each year, a new edition of Dance Studies arrives. This latest volume, No.12 in the series, is on one subject, "The Dance Folklore from Cuiavia". This study is one of the best there has been for some time, due perhaps to the fact that it deals with one subject, thoroughly researched by one person.

In the sixties, Dr.Lange spent ten years in the Polish region of Cuiavia, the home of the Kujawiak, and the results of this extensive fieldwork he shares with us in this very comprehensive study.

The study has been extremely well recorded. Dr. Lange is very thorough and presents all the various aspects; the region, the people, the costume, the music, the dance and its development, the steps and the relationship with other dances. The material is illustrated with Kinetograms, photographs, and musical examples.

Teachers or dancers who are interested in the Polish style, or who would like to extend their knowledge, will certainly enjoy this issue. I always find it fascinating to know how dances developed and changed, the historical impact etc. It gives the subject an added dimension.

Lillian Galatis taught six Greek village dances at the Kayroma Group on Friday, 27th January 1990. What's newsworthy about that, you may wonder. Two reasons. She is the first London-based teacher to visit the Group at Whitley Bay on the North-East coast, some ten miles East of Newcastle-upon-Tyne. Also, she came the day after the storm which closed the King's Cross-Peterborough railway line so that she was obliged to travel to Newcastle, via Cambridge(!), on a very overcrowded train which arrived at 4 p.m., three hours late. After next to no time at Kaye Poole's home in Heddon-on-the-Wall, there was a 15-mile drive to Whitley Bay for the evening teaching session. For all her long day of travelling and near-fasting, Lillian gave no sign of fatigue and, with her friendly, expert tuition, the Group spent a most enjoyable evening.

Many thanks to Lillian, not only for her teaching, but also for her determination to get here on that day. I understand that her return train journey on the following afternoon took the normal scheduled time of three hours.

S.I.F.D. folk are always welcome here. We may seem to be a long way off, but there is a good train service to Newcastle and we are close to the A.1 (Tyne Tunnel) road. Northumbria history, countryside and near—empty sandy beaches are all worth a look — and you don't have to wear an overcoat all the time!
