

Rehearsals are not possible, but I have written the name of the person who taught me/Worthing Group. Also, where I know that "regional variations" exist, I have written "R.V." and that means, try to dance with people who dance the same version as you do. We can have several circles/lines/sets.

One other thing I feel I should mention is that Worthing dancers will not have authentic costumes. We just try to look "foreign". If you are put out, put off, or irritated by R.V. and/or non-authentic costumes, then perhaps you should not volunteer as I cannot arrange rehearsals and costumes en masse.

The Borough Council are waiving the hire fees, and it is too good an opportunity to miss. The Pavilion is in the heart of Worthing, and the town will be full of visitors as well as local people. The Centenary Programme will be delivered to every house in the area. The chance to let people see WHAT we dance and enjoy, with massive free publicity, is too good to miss. I hope that some of you agree and will be able to join us. In the evening, I hope there will be dancing on the Esplanade by the Pavilion from 7 to 9.30—ish, or, if the weather is not good, I hope to have use of a nearby hall. Admission £1 or FREE. (Dance not suitable for beginners). Refreshments available all day via the Pavilion Denton Lounge Caterers. There will be snacks and a bar.

INTERNATIONAL RECIPES

Having seen a request for international recipes in the March edition of SIFD NEWS, I was quite disappointed not to find any in the April edition. Here is one of my favourite Bulgarian recipes, delicious as a "starter" with warm bread (Greek or French).

DRY TARATOR

500g. Yoghurt

150g. Cucumbers

60g. Walnut Kernels

15g. Vegetable Oil

Dill, salt and garlic to taste

Place yoghurt in a mixing bowl and add to it the finely chopped cucumbers, the crushed walnuts and garlic, the oil, dill and salt. Mix thoroughly with a wooden spoon and serve with finely chopped parsley on top.

"MAZURY"

Since I moved from London a few years ago, I have missed being able to "pop along" to the Royal Festival Hall, the Barbican, Fairfield Hall, etc. to see any foreign dance groups that might be appearing, so when I heard that The Poles were coming to Bexhill, I made sure I did not miss seeing them on their one night appearance at the De La Warr Pavilion. "The Poles" in this case were the "Mazury", dance company of the Polish Y.M.C.A.

This company was formed in 1949 and has gone from strength to strength, now numbering around one hundred members. In the main, they are the children of Polish ex-servicemen and civilian exiles who came to this country during the war, who are determined to preserve the Polish folklore which is an integral part of their cultural heritage. It is particularly pleasing that they also have a thriving junior group of 11 to 16-year olds to carry on the tradition.

They presented a 2-hour programme of dances which included charming little village dances as well as the grander Oberek, Mazur, Polonaise, Kujawiak; also popular dances from Lublin and from Zywiec and Szamotuly. Their performance of Troyak, with just the one set of two girls and a boy on stage, was absolutely delightful and without any superfluous embellishments. Other dances were Kolomyjka, and also a medley from the Podhale, and they finished with everyone on stage for a rousing and colourful Krakowiak.

The costumes were lovely, and the dancers were accompanied throughout by an excellent folk band.

They are a truly amateur group, in the real sense of the word "amateur", dancing for the love of it, and this really comes across in their performance. Without the pizazz of a professional group, and the better for it.
