HARROW FOLK FESTIVAL - AUGUST 1991

John Lawes, the Festival Director, has informed us that unfortunately this Festival has had to be cancelled for this year. This is because the Local Authority in Harrow made a massive increase in the rent for Harrow Schools. This caused the Festival expenses to become enormous, and gave John and his Committee no time to make other arrangements, in spite of help and encouragement from the E.F.D.S.S. It was therefore felt wise to cancel the Festival for this year and to work towards putting the event on again in 1992.

There will therefore not be any S.I.F.D. Dance on 18th August, as was announced in the February 1991 edition of SIFD NEWS, but we shall hope to participate in the Harrow Festival next year.

40TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS - A REMINISCENCE

I felt it might be appropriate this month to remind members of our celebrations of five years ago in connection with our 40th anniversary. The actual meeting forming the S.I.F.D. was held on 31st July 1946, and many of our present members attended on that occasion.

As the years went by, various milestones were marked by special occasions, and when the 40th anniversary arrived your Committee felt that we should do something spectacular. I have been looking back through the SIFD NEWS for 1986, and find we celebrated in many ways.

Each edition of our NEWS had "40th Anniversary Year" printed on the cover. A 20foot long banner was bought, and was taken to the first Sunday Dance of the year at Cecil Sharp House. This banner went to most events in the London area, including the Boat Trip, the Victoria Embankment Gardens performances, and Sidmouth.

Lesley Boorer designed her famous T-shirts, with the line of dancers carrying a banner, and these are still very popular. The same design appeared on mugs. A booklet of George Sweetland's memories of the past history of the S.I.F.D. was published, with illustrations, and copies are still available at £1.50 each.

The main celebrations took place on the weekend of 10th/11th May, when there was a Dance Swop Workshop on Saturday, followed by a mammoth Dance at the Porchester Hall in the evening, with 360 people attending. On the Sunday, 150 or so of us went for a Boat Trip down the Thames to the Thames Barrier, and back. Many were in costume, and we had live music.

As about 60 or 70 of us went to Sidmouth at the beginning of August, we were able to arrange a party on 3rd August in the Guide Headquarters to remember the founding of our Society, and drink a toast. Janice Gilliam provided a birthday cake.

Through the year many of the groups/classes ran their own special celebratory dances, started off by Janet Woolbar's Central London Class holding a party in the Conference Hall at the then London's County Hall - a very memorable experience for those who attended. In December we had a final weekend of dancing, with a Tea Dance on the Saturday at Baden Powell House, and a Dance in costume after the A.G.M. on the Sunday.

One thing which we did not manage to organize was Carpet Bedding. This was suggested by Iris Birch (Worthing) and possibilities were investigated. It refers to the large beds of flowers in parks and open spaces, which often show designs sent in by local clubs and charities. This might be an idea for someone to bear in mind for theGolden Jubilee in five years' time. A fairly simple design has to be produced and taken to one's local Parks Department, usually a couple of years before it is needed, as there is a lot of competition. It would be nice if someone could organize this!


