LETTERS TO THE EDITOR

Dear Lily,

I have almost a thousand L.P.s from practically all of the Eastern European countries but primarily from Hungary and Romania (including all of the major Hungarian operas). None of these records has ever been played more than once so they are all in practically new condition. I am selling all of them for £5.00 each plus postage which is £1.45 (totalling £6.45). Owing to a heart attack and major stroke out in Katmandu (Nepal), it is now impossible for me to do any strenuous dancing, so I must sell these records and hope to use the money to do more round the world 'plane trips.

My plan for the future is to live half of the year in New Zealand and the other half in Southern Spain (Costa del Sol) and make occasional visits back to London to watch ballet companies and musicals, and occasional visits to the hospital.

I enjoyed thirteen years dancing, acting and choreographing in ballet companies, musicals, films, television, cabaret, pantomimes and aquashows in England and Italy. When television came in, it killed the theatre so I had to leave the theatre but after that I danced with the many amateur folkdance groups - Bulgarian, Yugoslav, Spanish, Russian, Ukrainian, Polish, Czechoslovak, and then created the Hungarian (Balaton), Romanian (Martisorul) and Doina (Eastern European) dance groups until I was compelled to give this up because of the heart attack and strokes. I also helped to build up the Hungarian dance group in Bradford, Tokaji.

In addition to the records, I also have a Russian piano accordion which I bought in the GUM store in Moscow, which is full size and has never been played. I bought it during a train trip on the Trans-Siberian railway many years ago. Can I have an offer for this please! Maybe someone in the Dunav band may be interested, or their many fans.

I also have the following items for sale:-

Many yards of Hungarian folklore material and table runners, collected during my 27 visits to Hungary.

Quite a lot of Romanian table runners.

Many yards of Turkish folklore material which I bought at the Istanbul bazaar. This material seems to be very popular among the many dance groups which I have been to in Turkey.

Some Bulgarian table covers, collected when I danced with Danny Lumley's Bulgarian group.



POLKA LUBELSKA and TRAMBLANKA

The Polish music that Wilf contributed to the June NEWS is the tune we know as *Polka Lubelska* (polka from the Lublin region). It is commonly used by Polish groups, perhaps followed by *mach*, walc and oberek, to make up a suite of dances from that region,

The dance *Tramblanka* is another kettle of fish and is not in fact a polka at all but is in 3/4 time, and is not a true folk dance in that it is the creation of the Mazowsze Song and Dance Company, based on the distinctive 12-bar tune of a folk dance from the Opoczno region, *Polka-mazur*.

Polka-mazur, raz, dwa, tzry, raz, dwa, trzy, raz, dwa, trzy. Kto nie umie, niech patrzy, niech patrzy, niech patrzy, A kto umie, niech tańczy. Polka-mazur, raz, dwa, tzry.



The *Tramblanka* tune departs from that of *Polka-mazur* and new song words were written for it with a different pattern of repetition and adding extra syllables to all but the second line (which I found somewhat to my discomfort as a non-Polish-speaker struggling to get my tongue round them when first attempting to sing it, especially in bars 11+12 where the words of bars 5+6 and 7+8 have to fit a different rhythm – such a shift of stress wouldn't work in English):

Oj, zagraj ta nam poleczkę, poleczkę, poleczkę.

Oj, potańcuje troszeczkę.

Oj, potańcuje troszeczkę.

Oj, zagraj ta nam poleczkę.

Oi, potańcuje troszeczke.

Dobra poleczka bo skoczna......
Ale najlepsza z'Opoczna......

Oj, dobry dzbanek i szklanka..... Ale najlepsza tramblanka......

Ishould like to take this opportunity to congratulate Wilf on his extensive contribution to the NEWS over the years. As a result, the club nights have been more varied since September and our membership has improved accordingly (sadly we are also about to lose two couples as they are leaving the country for a while). We still have the normal nights run alternately by either James Webb, who gives us a Balkan evening, or by Celia Stone and me, when we give a mixture of Romanian and European. Interspersed with this have been a succession of teachers who have taught us French, Israeli, Welsh, English, American and Greek dances. All these teachers have taken more than one club night, so we have had a very full year so far. This will be followed by West Hallam Well Dressing Festival and Kirk Hallam Church Festival, where we have been asked to demonstrate Old English Dances.

As the school year draws to a close and the holiday season begins, the Committee will be busy with the preparations for our big celebration in September. This year we celebrate our 21st birthday and we are celebrating the event with a weekend of dance on 22nd-24th (see Dates for your Diary).
