

SCOTTISH MOUTH MUSIC FOR DANCING /SCOTTISH BULGARIAN CONCERT - 13TH March, St. Paul's Church, London, NW1. Starring Talitha MacKenzie and Dessislava Stefanova

On one of her rare appearances in London, world-famous Talitha MacKenzie led a workshop on Scottish mouth music (**puirt-a-beul**) and accompanying folk dances. This was an exciting opportunity to learn Strathspey, reel and jig styles, singing in Gaelic at the same time. A literally breathtaking experience.

Talitha took us through **Dannsa Nan Tunnagan** - Dance of the Ducks - originally performed by young girls as they led the animals from the family living quarters to summer pastures. She demonstrated the children's version, squatting on the floor and walking forward in crouch position, but taught us the more sedate, adult version, a combination of setting and travelling steps.

The high spot of the day was learning **SAOR AN T-SABHAIDH** - **The joiner's song.** This begins gloriously with **Faca tu.** And yes, if you're wondering, this is pronounced like the "F" word, with a slight aspiration at the end. There's something very liberating about shouting this out at the top of your voice. **Faca tu** means "Have you seen?", the air being a fertility song about a joiner and his saw.

During the day we learnt many interesting facts about life in the Scottish Islands. Talitha demonstrated her vocal dexterity by imitating a bagpipe and a metal string harp, and told us about "waulking" songs, melodies sung when women were beating out newly woven cloth. The cloth, first soaked in urine to set the dye, was tied at both ends, and passed around a table. As each woman received the fabric, she would beat it twice on the table, and hand it to her neighbour, accompanying the song with claps and thigh slaps until it was her turn to thump the cloth again.

We drove out evil spirits with **CHAILLEACH AN DUDAIN - WOMAN OF THE DUST -** a chant associated with New Year and originally sung at Sambhain, October 31st. An old wise woman would go into a trance and become a spirit medium. The villagers would surround the woman and stamp in an irregular beat towards her, singing to ward off evil forces.

We learnt the beautiful **FRAOCH A RONAIGH - HEATHER FROM RONAY -** a magical, haunting sailor's tune about the pain of leaving one's native land. Then a complete change of atmosphere, the lively Breton dance **CHANGERAIS-TU?**

This unusual, fascinating workshop was followed by a Scottish-Bulgarian concert. In the evening, the inspiring Talitha joined the amazing Dessi and the London Bulgarian Choir. Talitha sung a variety of Gaelic songs, occasionally inviting the audience to join in. The Bulgarian choir beautifully performed several favourites, and departed from their usual style by accompanying Talitha in two Gaelic numbers.

A truly memorable day.

PROGRAMME FOR NEFFA IS NOW ON THE 'NET

In the December 2003 SIFD NEWS I wrote about the forthcoming New England Folk Festival in Boston, Massachusetts, 23rd to 25th April 2004. The programme has now been posted in the NEFFA website, www.neffa.org. Click on Program Grids or Program Schedules and you have a choice of formats to print out. The PDF Grid is particularly useful as it gives you a complete over-view of the whole weekend on two pages.

The programme is mind-boggling. I counted about 250 separate events and every conceivable aspect of folk dance, music and craft is represented over the weekend. There are workshops, participatory dancing, parties and performances galore, and a feature of NEFFA is the ad-lib music jamming that goes on in the corridors of the Natick High School, around the corners, in the classrooms, on the stairwells (great acoustics!) and quite possibly in the toilets!

This year is the 60th NEFFA without a break, so they've had plenty of time to polish their act to a peak of perfection. As the dollar has been weakening steadily against the pound, it's getting cheaper and cheaper to visit the U.S. Approximate admission prices for the whole weekend are: adults £30, seniors £23, teens £14 and children £9. But you have to get there and stay somewhere. Several nearby hotels are listed on the web site AND you'll be home in time for Eastbourne!

I seriously suggest you browse the web site, allow yourself to drool over the programme, and consider a visit this year. You won't regret it. Give me a call on 01733 348880 for any useful information I can add. I've been going to NEFFA for years - never miss it if I'm in the hemisphere!
