Residential Macedonian Folk Dance Course with Paul Mulders at Derwent Bank 27th -29th October

Paul Mulders from Holland has specialised in Macedonian folk dance and music. During the eighties he was Pece's right hand man and often assisted him with his summer courses and translated for him. So part of his repertoire is from Pece's research. He travelled all over Macedonia and spent a lot of time with village people, which is the source of the other dances in his programme. He also had the opportunity to dance at gypsy weddings in the Bitola and Prilep regions. Paul's courses are immensely enjoyable, and at the same time he is very skilful in passing on the subtleties of Macedonian dance. Many of the dances that he has taught have stood the test of time and are still popular in our repertoire. Paul has a wealth of background information about the dances that he teaches and Macedonian folklore. This residential weekend will be held at the HF country house hotel of Derwent Bank, on the shore of Derwentwater, in the Lake District. It includes comfortable twin, double, family or single en-suite accommodation and full-board with a plentiful choice of good food. Dancers can select either the General or Intermediate course, or both courses, and there will be social dancing in the evenings. Bourrées et Autres Choses

French dancing has become quite popular in recent years. There are groups, clubs and classes in several places around the country as well as 'On Bouge' in London and 'Le Breizho', the Breton group.

The dances learnt when these groups meet (with the exception of Le Breizho) seem to be gathered from many regions within France, but the style of performance is usually, and not unnaturally, what one might call 'French generic'.

Areas of France which were once remote from each other are now, with modern communications, next door and in consequence some subtleties of regional style have tended to disappear.

What do you dance at a French evening? Typically there will be couple dances (Mazurkas, Schottisches and Waltzes) and there may be Breton non-partner dances (An Dro, Hanter Dro, Gavottes etc.) but a large part of the evening will undoubtedly be devoted to Bourrées. Bourrées come only, as far as we can tell, from the central regions of France - Auvergne, Bourbonnais, Nivernais, Limousin, Berry - but there is a wonderful diversity of form and style to be found under this one name.

The berrichonne bourrées in the SIFD repertoire were taught to us by Pierre Panis (1911-1993) who collected dances from old people in his native countryside during the early part of his career and who was meticulous in passing on the berrichon style to his students.

Berry was one of the ancient provinces of France and the name is not to be found on modern maps. In 1790 the Assemblée Constituante, trying to suppress provincial identity and spirit, divided France into departments and Berry is now, approximately, Cher (Haut Berry) and Indre (Bas Berry). George Sand, famous among other things for her depiction of peasant life in Berry in the early 19th century wrote "Aucun peuple ne danse avec tant de passion et de gravité en même temps que les Berrichons" (No people dance with so much passion and, at the same time, so much seriousness as the Berrichons). We will be doing our best at the Day Course on March 11th to see what she meant. There will not be time to go through all 19 dances on C6 (see the list in the February NEWS) so any requests would be gratefully received.

Notes from the Internet

I thought I'd write an update on www.interfolk.co.uk now it is nearing its first anniversary. We have now provided web-pages for nine south coast clubs from Gosport to Bexhill-on-Sea. It does appear to have resulted in more people trying out our groups with a gain of 3 new people that I know of; they had moved into the area and used the internet to find out what was on locally. However the Portsmouth group has established itself with 12-14 people in less time entirely by traditional methods. So the website helps by reaching some people but word-of-mouth is still best.

We have also had many queries on all sorts of dance related subjects where Janet's knowledge is invaluable. The most exciting was a television company looking for a Russian display group who we put in touch with Orlyk in Manchester. We've found a Serbian costume for a dance school in Worthing (via Ibrahim Riveski), helped several primary school teachers with their English Country dance lessons, provided a Derbyshire teacher with SIFD contacts for Romanian dance, passed on details of the SIFD shop for music as well as finding people their nearest ballroom class, folk music club, barn-dance band etc. Janet was totally unperturbed by a request for a Jewish marching band for a Bar Mitzvah - instantly giving out details of Klapton Klezmer! So the site is serving a purpose in at least letting people know that international folk dance exists.

The reason for our 'fame' is that anyone searching for a wide variety of folk dancing topics on the web using Google, has been told that our site is the most relevant. There are many (boring) technical reasons for this. Simply put, the search engines assign a 'trust worthiness' rank to each site and the highest scorers are more likely to be offered as a top result. I believe we were assigned a high trust rank initially because we were the only site that links to almost every other international folk dance site in the UK and thus became a resource site. The net effect of my efforts is that I have recently been able to 'adjust the internet' to give a boost to all the SIFD group websites that I am able to. The immediate results are that now when you search the web for the 'Society for International Folk Dancing', the official SIFD site (www.sifd.org) is up six places to number 1.

Clearing the Loft

Clearing an untouched loft is certain to bring discovery and memory! So what of the programme for the Central London Y.H.A.Group dance at Cecil Sharp House on Friday 16th March 1956. 7 till 10.pm. M.C. Bert Price. Band: The Wallace Collection. Admission 2/6d (say 13 pence in today's currency). Thirty six dances were listed, about the same number as for our monthly Sunday dances, which implies few if any were walked through! All were couple or set, so men were expected aplenty if not in excess! Since then although the balance of the sexes has changed and we have had fifty years of adding dances to the repertoire, any of about one third of those dances could still appear at a Sunday dance!

It is not that there were no line or circle dances then, there were, although far fewer in number. I encountered them mainly at dances and the notorious 'cellars' in Drury Lane, to live music. The nationalities represented are of interest, being (apart from English and Scottish) biased towards northern and western Europe, whereas a programme today would be towards eastern and southeastern Europe plus Israeli!

But what of the dances? Unsurprisingly, vitality was required for many, with the tempo for some being faster than they would be played today, but they really were enjoyed! How many would have attended that Friday evening?



My guess is about one hundred, the organisers would have expected the Kennedy Hall to be full!

A final thought for the planning programme for the sixtieth anniversary dance, please do not even consider the Eightsome Reel! Or Hopak!
