### <u>Margaret Webb</u>

Margaret, (formerly Colato, neé Harris), must have joined Harrow Green at a very early age, as when later when she had transferred her activities to the Society, then at Hortensia Road Girls School in Chelsea, and as a prominent member of Philip Thornton's Balkan Group, there is an archive photograph of her looking splendid, taken for the RAH "See How They Dance" programme when she was still in her teens.

Margaret's dance interests were catholic and it wasn't long before Bert Price encouraged her to join him in the Polish Folk Dance Group 'YMCA' and a love of Mazur remained with her always; and about the same time she joined Lucile Armstrong's Spanish Group, as did 'Steve' Steventon.

However, there were problems with 'YMCA'. They had acquired a new tutor who felt the necessity of keeping Polish emigré culture as pure as possible decided members must only be Polish or of Polish ancestry, so Bert and Margaret were asked to leave; but they, having heard that the leader (Ziutek) of a Polish Folk Group visiting Britain wished to defect gave him their support and help. As by that time I was a friend of Margaret, I played a minor part in this and more details can be found in the SIFD 'History'. To cut the story short 'Opoczno' grew from its beginnings with a mixed Polish and British membership. There were many demonstrations, including an item in the spectacular 'Harvest Dozynki' at the Festival Hall. It may be a lapse of memory but while I cannot remember Margaret being there, there can be no doubt that without her and Bert there would have been no SIFD Polish Groups.

It must have been about the same time that Margaret began to devote her abundant energy establishing her own group, chiefly because she wanted to include flamenco in the curriculum. Again, in the 'History', I noted how the enterprise which was to become 'Los Ibericos' began in the basement of a small coffee bar in the King's Road, and how it grew to fill the large hall at Hugh Myddleton School with about a hundred dancers all chanting the mantra, "Point, twiddle, twiddle, stamp, stamp, flick". There were many shows and smaller demonstrations, and while some of the costumes were hurriedly cobbled together, others were beautifully made including a dress from Valencia, a 'costume of lights' (for matadors). All this was due to Margaret's foresight and energy and her ability to find, and persuade willing volunteers. The group also visited the Seville fair on two occasions an event not to be missed. The comic bullfight at one of the RAH shows was quite something, with the men in their marvellous costumes, and me the back half of the bull and Valerie (in fishnet tights) in front. Margaret always made sure the best people always did the teaching, for example, her best friend and flat mate Pat Regan took the regular advanced class. Many of her dancers were individual members of the SIFD, so that the Society benefitted greatly from her loyalty at this time.

Although Alex never joined the Group, she and I spent many a happy evening at their Spanish parties. Very sadly, at the Toynbee Hall, backstage Margaret injured her back and never fully recovered from her injury.

# Residential Macedonian Dance Course at Derwent Bank 12th - 15th November 2010

Paul Mulders from Holland is a specialist of Macedonian folk dance and music. During the eighties he often assisted Pece Atanasovski (a leading exponent of Macedonian folkdance and music) with his summer courses and translated for him. He travelled all over Macedonia and spent a lot of time with village people. He also had the opportunity to dance at gypsy weddings in the Bitola and Prilep regions. Paul's courses are immensely enjoyable, and at the same time he is very skilful in passing on the subtleties of Macedonian dance. Many of the dances that he has taught have stood the test of time and are still popular in our repertoire. Paul has a wealth of background information about the dances that he teaches and Macedonian folklore.

This residential long weekend will be held at the HF country house hotel of Derwent Bank on the shores of Derwentwater in the heart of the Lake District. It includes comfortable twin, double, family or single en-suite accommodation and full-board with a plentiful choice of good food. Dancers can select either the General or Intermediate course, or both courses. There will be social dancing in the evenings, with live music and a review of Paul's dances.

There will also be an opportunity to learn Macedonian songs at Mike Machin's workshops. It is an excellent area for walking or sightseeing, and, leaders willing, half-day walks for dancers and full-day walks for non-dancers will be offered. Non-dancing friends and family are welcome to come and enjoy the facilities of the house and grounds. Full board accommodation (3 nights) is £198, single course £32, both courses £56.


