

On Show



On Saturday 25th September a group of us from the Committee went to the CCPR's "On Show" at the Royal Albert Hall, to watch and support the dancers performing Armenian and Russian dances on behalf of the SIFD. We very much enjoyed their item. Congratulations are due to all involved. We thank them and especially producer Janet Douglas for all their hard work. The costumes looked most impressive. The large audience enjoyed the performance - when it ended it received an enthusiastic and rewarding round of applause.

The SIFD's appearance was obviously the highspot for us, but the whole Show was very enjoyable, and well worth watching. Dance and other items involving movement and pattern always look especially good from the high viewpoint that the Royal Albert Hall offers.

The Show culminated in a spectacular finale. While all the producers (including our own Janet Douglas) were being individually acknowledged and presented on stage the arena filled with hundreds of the performers, from all the participant organisations, including our dancers (who we could just about pick out). There followed a memorable final item (with surprises!).

Walking back to the station afterwards we realised it was well after six o'clock. The afternoon had just flown by.

A Nice Show - On Show 2010

A very nice show, indeed. Over three hours of colourful performances, and among them the very pretty SIFD contribution "From Russia to Armenia", a sequence of four dances. It should have been called "From Armenia to Russia", because the first two dances were Armenian, followed by two Russian dances. I was involved in dancing with another group (the Quadrille Club), so I had the opportunity and pleasure of spectating the SIFD performance from the balcony above.

All four dances (Sepastia Bar, Ambee Dageetz, Kalinushku Lamala, and Moy Muzhenka) were fairly simple ones and, I believe, well known to most members of the Society.



They are among the favourites at our Fleet group, and appear very often on our programme. But it makes quite a difference dancing in a small group of about twenty people in a small church hall, and performing in a troupe of four score or more people in lovely regional costumes taking to the floor at the huge Royal Albert Hall. The choreography was simple, but very effective, and I felt quite sorry I wasn't down there dancing as well. In the programme, Janet Douglas was listed as the producer and she deserves congratulations for organising so many dancers into such a pleasing performance.

It is a pity that it will take another five years before the next show in the Royal Albert Hall is due. But at least we have the annual Dance around the World, which at the time of writing this, I can still look forward to. I love the manifold programme of the DATW weekend, and the opportunity not only to watch, but participate and taste new dancing styles. I believe this year's programme is already on the internet, but I haven't looked at it yet. I have recently learned a bit of Turkish, so might try some dancing from that country, if it is on offer. Or, maybe not, if the dance is Kolbasti, originating from the Trabzon area on the Black Sea Coast.

I have recently read about a Turk from Trabzon living with his family in New Zealand. After having an exceptionally profitable day at their kebab shop in the High Street, they started celebrating in the car park outside the shop by dancing Kolbasti. The police were called and the Turk was arrested for wife beating. Kolbasti apparently involves energetic arm swinging, kicking, slapping and wrestling movements, including headlocks. Are there any teachers in SIFD qualified to teach Kolbasti?





RAH On Show



On Show 2010



I can't begin to guess how many rehearsal hours On Show represented at the Royal Albert Hall on 25th September – I can only tell you they were worth it. A group of us went to the show together and really enjoyed it.

There were 25 dance displays, creating a programme which ranged through a wide spectrum of dance styles and disciplines. They varied enormously – from exuberant cheerleading and a gymnastics team to the ordered synchrony of the Fitness League and Margaret Morris Movement, from a modern take on Morris dancing to a most moving presentation from Dance Voice Therapy for able and disabled dancers.

And in between were more traditional dance displays, in which the SIFD fitted very nicely. Ours were easily the most spectacular and colourful costumes, and Janet Douglas had chosen four Armenian and Russian dances with lovely music, joining them together to make a most pleasing presentation. The arena was filled with about 50 SIFD members from many different areas and groups, and we should all be most grateful to everyone who gave up so much time to rehearse and perform, and gather and make costumes, on behalf of the SIFD. And especially we are grateful to Janet for her time and energy in organising the display; without her the SIFD would not have been represented. Thank you.

Arin-Arin

This Basque dance is invariably performed after the Fandango. The Fandango is in 3/4 time (sometimes 6/8) while Arin-Arin provides a contrast being in 2/4 time, also it is often played

at a faster tempo.

Joan and I learnt both these dances from Albert Poigt (the leader of a wellknown Parisian Basque Group) on a dance course in Poitiers in 1959. We taught the dances to the SIFD on many occasions since then and at one time there was a Basque proficiency badge taken by a few courageous members. At the Swansea Summer School in 1971 Paulette Claisse (a member of Albert's group) taught Basque and revised these dances amongst others. The Basque style which we learnt from Albert and which we tried to pass on is very precise (almost athletic) but the dances seem to be danced in a much more relaxed manner in the four Spanish Basque provinces.

According to the ex-pat Mendiola, (as in website Simon mentions above) there are various versions, apart from some set pieces that are fixed (e.g., there is always a turning step) there's no "right way" of doing these dances because of the variety of steps.

Arin arin was a "pilgrimage dance" in the eighteenth century, and being a pilgrimage dance means it can be put to any music. For this same reason, different types of instruments can be used such as tambourine and txistu, the dultzaina and drum, or alboka or trikitixa and tambourine. Also, different types of costumes which should suit the music.
