

Somogyi Karikázó

Alan Trangmar was quite right to assume that the two songs used for the dance are just two short songs. Incidentally, the 'i' means 'from' (Somogy). The gy + i at the end almost represent the French mon <u>Di</u>eu in that it's almost swallowed as the 'd' in morning <u>d</u>ew. But <u>why</u> these two songs, was not made clear.

When the priests banned any form of dancing, the girls whose job it was to watch the flocks of geese, got bored as small (and some bigger) children would. They started to sing the little songs learnt at their mothers' knees. Then, out of sight of the priests, they would join hands in simple walking, running steps as they played little games. Thus developed girls (mostly round or line) dances, singing the songs of their own village and region. As in the U.K. there are many, many little songs from each region.

Does anyone remember the visit some SIFD members made to Hungary years ago? The women of Galgamcsa actually gave a demonstration of how they taught the children their songs - holding them against their knees as the mothers themselves sang for us. Lovely.

Thinking of geese, does anyone remember the visit to Hollókő (now a UNESCO site)? Remember how the geese formed themselves into ranks for their homeward journey, and how they, like cows to their stalls in the byre, knew exactly which gateway to turn into - and in the correct order!!!

I well remember watching, from the hill with a ruined fort, at sundown the "marshalling" of the "troops", then we raced back to the village for the end of the "parade" while villagers made us keep out of the determined path of the home-coming geese!

Happy Days, and only one of the earliest of my 40+ trips to Hungary to study their dance and culture.

Residential Bulgarian & Balkan Folk Dance Course at Malhamdale 7th – 10th October 2011

Yves Moreau from Canada was one of the first enthusiasts to bring Bulgarian folk dance to the West. He has a wealth of knowledge and experience of Bulgarian dance and folklore, having lived there for two years, and then travelled there almost yearly to research dances and record folk music in all regions of the country. He also regularly presents workshops with a broader Balkan repertoire. He has travelled extensively in Macedonia, Serbia, Croatia, and Romania since 1969 and has worked with renowned teachers from these countries. Yves' teaching is inspirational and we look forward to another enjoyable weekend with him. This time he will bring dances from his oldest Bulgarian repertoire, most of which he has not taught previously in the UK. He will also share some of his favourites from neighbouring countries and possibly from further afield.

This residential long weekend is at the HF country house hotel, Newfield Hall, in a peaceful location in the southern part of the Yorkshire Dales National Park, less than half a mile from the Pennine Way, which leads north to the nearby geological wonders of Malhamdale. It includes comfortable twin, double, family or single en-suite accommodation and full-board with a plentiful choice of good food. Dancers can select either the General or Intermediate course, or both courses. There will be social dancing in the evenings, with live music and a review of Yves' dances. There will also be an opportunity to learn Bulgarian and Balkan songs at Mike Machin's workshops. It is an excellent area for walking or sightseeing, and, leaders willing, half-day walks for dancers and full-day walks for non-dancers will be offered. Non-dancing friends and family are welcome to come and enjoy the facilities of the house and grounds. Full board accommodation (3 nights) is £200, single course £36, both courses £60.




Zivko Firfov Folklore Group; Balkan Party 4th Dec. 2010
