Report from the Last Committee Meeting

The last meeting was much more successful than the previous one – many items made significant progress.

The first was initialising the first request for a **CRB** check for a member. Timed nicely with the news from the Government that CRB checks will be needed less often in future. So a faint victory – but still a step forward.

A date for this year's **AGM** was selected in September.

Finances. How we will cope when cheques are phased out was discussed – not for a while yet, but we feel confident that we will have systems in place well before that. Judith circulated draft accounts for 2010, and is starting on those for the Charity Commission.

Dalila produced a draft of a much-clearer **Membership Form**. It has been increased to A4 size, and should be easy to fill in without mistakes!

It is very clear at the moment that the structure of the Society's membership is changing – individual membership is going down, while the number of groups is increasing. We talked about the benefits of **individual membership**, and would like ideas from members about how we could make individual membership more attractive. Any ideas would be welcomed, and will result in a discussion at the AGM.

Jeanette is working on an **advertising card**, with photos and basic information about the SIFD. This will be very useful for handing out, and should have Instant Appeal. Our current leaflets are really more useful when someone already knows about the Society, and wants further information, so this new card will fill a gap.

The **digitalising all of Wilf Horrocks's music** (estimated at between 800 and 1000 pieces) is leaping ahead, and we actually discussed arrangements for when the work is finished. The **P10 committee** are excelling themselves with progress on this new CD, but warn not to get too excited yet.

Helen attends the **Sport and Recreation Alliance** (previously CCPR) meetings on our behalf, and reported back on the last. A report on the **Eastbourne Festival** was also handed round. Altogether a more satisfying meeting.

Jack Richardson

I was sorry to hear the news about Jack although I knew that he was far from well. The news brought back so many memories of the past and of the Society when I joined in 1951 [I think]. I think I first met him at one of the dances he organised at the Rector's lawn of the old lovely building of Imperial College at the rear of the Royal Albert hall that no longer exists.

I was one of group of dancers at the recording sessions in the Rector's beautiful board room at the College for the Society's first records that were issued on old shellac 78 rpm records. We danced in complete silence on thick carpeting to help the musicians with tempi and endings. At the time we had a fine band known as the Wallace Collection who used to play for the monthly dances at Cecil Sharp House. The recordings were excellent and made on a Ferrograph tape recorder that was probably the best machine available at the time. Jack also used to make one off copies on metal discs coated with shellac, on a recorder at the college, for use at classes as portable tape or cassette recorders were not obtainable.

I have happy memories of the weekends away that he organised in some lovely locations and the dancing and long walks he led. I like to forget the "short cuts" and the mud that always seemed a feature of a walk.

The Swansea Summer School was also a memorable time. It was hard work but there were always a lovely group of people and a wonderful atmosphere and lovely people, I remember the rather scatty evenings after dinner with a little booze. Sometimes Bert Price brought homemade beer or there was Simon Guest's homemade wine [known as "National Health"]. I hear that this atmosphere has continued. Does anyone remember Donald who used to play the piano for most of the dance sessions?

Jack asked me to teach Jugoslav dances at a couple of the early Schools that were held in the large house at the entrance to Singleton Park and later in the larger accommodation in the University buildings.

Jack was such a friendly person and always so enthusiastic, and always around should help be needed. After his unfortunate amputation he continued to join in as many activities as he could and was an inspiration to others to keep going whatever problems they may have. He and Joan often came to the Živko Firfov Christmas Dance and it was always nice to see them, especially when I came to live in Spain.

Joan was always around to help him when he was organising activities for the Society. She was always around to help him after he became handicapped and during his failing health. Despite her own recent health problems she continued to care for him, and I'm sure that all of us who know her send our condolences, our thanks and our best wishes for the future.

George Sweetland

It was always enjoyable to be in George's company, not only for interesting conversation but his great sense of humour, and he made a very good companion to be with on a holiday. He was always at Llangollen, and we would discuss the competitions over a pint or two in the pub. In 1958 he accompanied me on one of my early trips to Macedonia where the way of life had not changed very much to that existing before the War. Travelling in buses that were well past their sell by date on rough dusty roads and across dried up river beds where the bridges had been destroyed, did not deter his enjoyment of the experience. He treated it like an expedition as it was in the days before air travel, and the journey took three days from London and sometimes having to stand for hours in the corridor, as far as possible away from the toilet.

I think I first met him at one of the Sunday night dances held in the old Gym in the Inns of Court Mission in Drury Lane, but he seemed to turn up for most Society events. He enjoyed folk dancing and his reports from the International Eisteddford at Llangollen were always very informative. He was, for many years an active member of the Spanish and Portuguese dance group "Los Ibericos" organised by Margaret Colato who died not so long ago. He always came to watch the Živko Firfov group when they gave a performance, and also to their annual Christmas dance, but he kept up with the activities of most other groups.

In recent years he was not in good health and he missed Alex very much after she died last year.

The Society has lost so many of its notable members in recent years, and I hope that we do not forget them and the contributions that they made.
