Please note that we have only been able to book the main hall for the Saturday workshop so we may have to restrict numbers on Sunday.




Balkanplus

Report from the Last Committee Meeting

This seemed to be a marking-time meeting – lots discussed and noted and planned, but not much satisfactorily concluded.

I can, however, report definite progress with Jeanette's advertising card. All mapped out – just need to refine the photos on the front and the wording on the back. And the logo. It might not sound like it, but it's nearly there.

Wilf Horrocks's music is being digitised at a tremendous rate -531 tunes have been completed, with 91 in progress. And there are still more to come. Amazing to realise the Society has/had such a large repertoire; this will be a great resource when it's finished.

We need to thank the Payling family for much of this. Ruth is working with Jeanette on her card; Holly, with Miles, is patiently transferring Wilf's dots to electronic format, and Judith, as always, is tirelessly working on the Society's finances. I wish I could report a healthy forecast for the year, but unfortunately Judith predicts a deficit. Our income is falling while our outgoings rise. But all is not lost – prudent management in the past, and very generous donations, mean the Society still has money, and we are looking for ways to produce an income/outgoings balance in future.

A new group was added to the list of affiliated groups – welcome to Croydon International Folk Dance.

Although we were unable to find a way to become sponsors for Overseas Teachers, a friendly association has offered to help us out. There should be a separate item on this elsewhere in the News.

We do, though, now have a policy on the Recruitment of Ex-Offenders, which Group leaders will be lucky enough to get when they receive their request to renew their membership for 2011-2012. (This was a requirement before being allowed to apply for CRB checks for our members. Our first request for one has, at yet, produced no result.)

Our next meeting is in June. If there is anything you would like to bring up, please let me know.

Bringing Non-EU Teachers into the UK

Please read this – it is important.

Bringing a dance teacher or performer into the UK from the EU or Switzerland or Norway (or bringing someone who lives outside these areas but holds a qualifying passport) is unaffected. But - unfortunately dance teachers from elsewhere now come under the restrictions imposed on "employing foreign migrants."

If you plan to bring in a dance teacher from a non-EU country, and pay them while they are here, the law now requires they must be registered with the UK Border Agency beforehand. The registration can only be done through an official agent who has been accepted by the UKBA as a sponsor. We tried to obtain recognition for the SIFD as an agent, but couldn't fulfil the necessary requirements – and it was also going to cost many hundreds of pounds in fees. So we have searched for a helpful organisation, and found an ally in the British Bluegrass Music Association.

The BBMA are willing to act as our agent, to register non-EU teachers for us. They would need to know about the teacher, their booked flights and where they will be teaching, and will charge ± 100 for this service.

If you need this service, I should be your first point of contact.

If someone is performing in the UK they will be liable for UK income tax, but fortunately if they are only teaching there is a special exemption from paying tax.

It is vital you are aware that bringing someone from outside the EU in to teach, without going through the proper channels, can result in a fine of up to $\pm 20,000$, and the teacher could be permanently barred from entering the UK.

Please come to us first if you want to bring in a non-EU teacher. The SIFD cannot accept responsibility if you break the law, but we can help to make sure you don't.

[To check countries in the EU, try www.europa.eu/abc and click on "Countries", or ask me for a list. Some countries outside the EU are USA (obviously) but less obviously – Albania, Serbia, Croatia, Ukraine.]



Two couple sets, couples facing. Lady on right of her partner. Sets may be anywhere on the floor.

Bars 1-4	3 scissor claps followed by 3 stamps, alternate feet.
----------	---

Bars 5-8 RH star, all walking round clockwise 8 steps.

- Bars 9-12 Repeat bars 1-4.
- Bars 13-16 LH star, all walking round anti-clockwise 8 steps.

Figure B

Bars 17-18 Ladies give R hands and change places with 4 walking steps. Bars 19-20 Courtesy turn, skipping (ladies forwards, men backwards) (Ladies give L hands to men's L, and men put R hands on ladies' waist.)

Bars 21-24 Repeat bars 17-20 to return to own partner.

Bars 25-32 Keeping the courtesy turn hold, skip round to meet a new couple with whom they repeat dance.
