Greek Folk Dance Course in Keswick

Wednesday 7th & Thursday 8th November 2012

Kyriakos comes from Thessaloniki in Greece. He teaches dances mainly from the north of Greece (Macedonia, Thrace, Pontos and Cappadokia). He is also familiar with village folk traditions and dances from all over Greece. Although he is new to most of us in the UK, he is already a popular teacher in Europe, Canada, the USA and of course in Greece. He is a delightful person to be with and speaks very good English. We are delighted that he is able to spend a few days with us in Keswick where he will share with us some of his dances.

Kyriakos will be teaching a two-day mid-week course in Keswick. (This is in addition to the weekend course at Malhamdale). There will be dance classes in the afternoons from 2:30 to 5:30 pm and then social dancing with further tuition in the evenings, together with live music from Mike Machin and Clyde Olliver. The mornings will be free for everyone (including Kyriakos) to relax or explore the area around Keswick. The dancing will take place in Crosthwaite Parish Hall next to the Coop supermarket near the centre of Keswick.

All kinds of accommodation is available in Keswick. At this time of the year many hotels are offering out of season deals. Particularly convenient are the hotels and guesthouses on "The Heads" with stunning views over Lake Derwentwater and the fells beyond. There are also numerous B&Bs, self catering accommodation and hostels. There will be options for having our evening meals together.

The cost of the two-day course is £30 and includes both the afternoon and evening dance sessions. It will be possible to come for part of the course or for the evening dancing if you wish. (More details on request).

The dance in **June is the 3rd** – which sounds back-to-normal, but is something of an experiment this year. Bognor Regis International Dance Ensemble

There have been a couple of major changes to BRIDE in the last couple of years. We had to move to a new hall for our weekly classes, unfortunately at twice the price, but it is a nicer environment with windows on all sides, and a library next door for parents who wish to quietly hide.

Class size has more than doubled and the new intake included **four boys**! One of them (a brother of another class member) immediately made it clear he was only joining for fun and definitely would not take part in any displays, and would absolutely never dress in any costume (but he's already wavering having joined in his favourite dances sporting a waistcoat).

Since moving we have been looking at a much wider range of International dances (apart from seasonal Maypole). The little ones prefer British dances, but sixteen year olds no longer find great joy in endless skipping and need more of a challenge. As a result I have lengthened the class time to allow for three overlapping classes for the different ages and abilities including a new spot for the <u>pre-school</u> age group (last month we learned that the Barlow group also now have tiny dancers).

These little ones come with very enthusiastic parents - not yet worn down with the grind of catering for extracurricular activities. Six of these new children joined the more experienced for a display at a local retirement complex just before Christmas. Their performance of Jenny Pluck Pears was received with great delight and at one point hilarity when the youngest dancer, kept running back to reposition and urge her partner (her five year old long-suffering sister) to "stay there".

With the help of one senior girl we start with song-dances and skipping practice for the youngest, and then getting to grips with the very difficult business of curtseying. Then as the middle group join us we enjoy dances like the Cumberland Reel (keeping order can be difficult with boys - who like to partner each other and gallop right across the hall). We have a 'shared' repertoire spot for all ages - currently Chilili, De Kolom and Kokatek seem to be favourites (We use one rubber chicken and a pair of Marigolds).

Towards the end of the class, after the smallest have left, we dance Turkish, Hungarian, Greek, and of course Armenian which is very popular with the girls especially Erzeroumi Shoror. The very end of the Tuesday class is for learning tricky new dances - currently Koshua bon Odori and Parson's Farewell.



A few of the girls have grown up with BRIDE - and strictly speaking are now officially adults. The other adults who join in displays dance regularly in other local groups (including East Preston and Gosport) and meet up with the children for displays and an occasional rehearsal.

Last year, we took part in the Chichester Mayfest, Hotham Park Heritage Fair and enjoyed dancing out at those and other events with a more heterogeneous image than in previous years (pictured above). As a 'first' we wore a mix of costumes from many different countries instead of all dressing in the same regional costume of just one country (sometimes two after a quick change). In the past I would acquire an authentic costume and make copies for everyone (but, by the next season nothing fitted, and that's not just the children). We have been given costumes and authentic fabrics by Winnie Beer, Iris Birch, Audrey Steele and her sister Kaye Lewis Poole, and, they are so good they need to be displayed more often. Besides, the costume collection is beginning to take over my house!

We are hoping to travel further afield this year, more about that next time.

Bridport International Folk Dance Club

Having started my own international folk dance club in October and become affiliated to the SIFD, I had my first teaching day on 21 January.

Being an ambitious sort of person, I went for the whole hog: Two teaching sessions (one aimed at experienced dancers, one for beginners) PLUS a three hour evening dance with a live band, preceded by an hour's walk-through! I was completely shattered for the following three days, especially with running to the music system after each dance to stop the computer playing "I'm not in Love" by 10CC which it had inexplicably decided was the done thing.

Overall, I was very happy with the outcome. We had a total of 32 people attending the day, 25 for the evening dance. We just about managed to cover our costs. We had prepared feedback forms and everyone who filled one in confirmed that they had enjoyed the day very much and would come again!

Naturally, there were a few minor hiccups, like the wayward computer and me being very nervous, hence muddling my steps at the walk-through. – It IS very nerve- wrecking having to teach 25 people of whom you know at least five have been teaching for 20 years or more, when you yourself have "had a go" for all but six weeks! I'll do better next time.

Maggie (O'Regan) did an excellent job of teaching a very mixed group, from complete beginners to very experienced. Not an easy task.

The live band was Balamouk from North Devon (formerly known as Pendragon) who have been playing Eastern European and "World" music for twenty years or more. Their music was very much appreciated. It is just so much nicer to have a live band!

At some point during the evening a newspaper man appeared uninvited, so, hopefully, there will be some good publicity in the paper (the local freebie) and maybe that will bring a few more feet to my club - then another of the major aims of the day will have been achieved.

Day of International Folk Dancing in Bridport

12 May 2012

Dalila Heath, a professional international folk dance teacher from London, will come to Church House (St. Mary's) Hall, South Street, Bridport and teach line and circle dances from Armenia and Israel, followed by an evening dance with live music.

The first teaching session is intended for dancers with little experience and those who want to increase their repertoire; the second session (starting at 15.00 hours) is aimed at experienced dancers who would like to learn some more intricate dances.

Balamouk will be playing in the evening, a five piece band from North Devon specializing in Balkan tunes. All dances will be preceded by a walkthrough. The evening social dance will be for dancers of all abilities.

Reit im Winkl

Reit im Winkl is a German ski resort in south eastern Bavaria, close to the Austrian border, in fact it is tucked into a little corner, which is what the name means: "Right in the Corner". Plattler is the famous Schuhplattler, or shoe slapping dance, though they slap plenty of other bits as well: hands, calves, thighs and occasionally bums. But that's the men. The girls just look demure, walking or spinning in their Dirndl dresses (capital D because all German nouns have capital initials). Dirndl means 'lassy'. Sometimes that dance is called Reit im Winkler Plattler, because adding the -er makes it an adjective, as in Hamburger, which means a man (or a sausage, or indeed anything else) from Hamburg. (I have never found a place called Beefburg.) www.phantomranch.net/folkdanc/dances/reitimvi.htm is a most informative website about the dance, and plenty of Youtubes to watch, taking me nostalgically back to the mid-sixties when I lived in Bavaria as a Thomas Cook holiday rep!
