Gordon Edwards 1928-2012

Those of you who used to enjoy the many SIFD weekends organized by Jack Richardson and Roy Clarke may remember Gordon. On Jack's morning walks the party would return with Gordon looking immaculate, still with creases in his trousers. He also loved to chat.

Gordon was a primary school teacher at Sidley County Primary School for over 31 years. At St. Lukes's Teacher Training College, Exeter, he took part in English folk dance displays. Then on an educational course he met Janet Loader who got him interested in international folk dance. So, in 1975 he went to Swansea Summer School. He thought everyone was bonkers - dancing everywhere and every moment of the day, even on the beach, and took himself off to the cinema for a break. However, he was thoroughly smitten, especially with the Balkan classes and subsequently attended various SIFD weekends.

Julie Korth set up monthly Sunday dance courses at Eastbourne Training College for her students, originally, which Gordon attended, starting off with Israeli in January 1977. The roast dinner at student prices was also a great attraction!

We met on Roy Clarke's weekend at Easthampstead Park near Bracknell later that year. I was dancing with Woodvale, Borough Green at the time and also attended some of Julie's courses, often with Rita Wood. Rita usually danced with Gordon's friend, Terry, and I would dance with Gordon. We married in 1983.

Gordon was also a professionally trained tenor and, after a year as an exchange teacher in New Zealand, he toured the country with the New Zealand Opera Company singing in 'The Magic Flute' and 'La Boheme'. He sang with several local operatic societies and the Bexhill Choral Society but especially with the Bexhill Light Operatic and Dramatic Society (BLODS) taking many leading roles from 1953 to 1998. He was renowned for his comic roles.

Sadly deafness and loss of balance stopped him singing and dancing eventually, though we still enjoyed some SIFD weekends up to 2004.

The acquisition of a tricycle in 2009 gave him many hours of pleasure and he became a well known sight around Bexhill in his yellow jacket meeting lots of people on his rides.

From the response to his death on July 23rd he will be greatly missed - especially by me.

Marina Wolstenholme taught **Devushki Padruzhenky** to Frith Folk at Chapel en le Frith in November 2001. As far as I can make out a good translation is 'All girls together'.

It is a dance in a circle and the dominant feature is a move towards the centre of the circle followed by backing out as a spiral, either left or right, alternately, following a track shaped like a banana. That is why our dancers, who do not speak Russian, call it 'the banana dance'. It is a good dance for winding down before going home at the close of a class.
