### **Unique Exhibition Coming to the Hellenic Centre!!**

Advance News red hot off the press!!

Many of you will remember Natassa Lemos' fabulous courses at an early Swansea, so that in itself will recommend the Exhibition she is working so hard to arrange and promote. Officially entitled 'Patterns of Magnificence' it will bring more than 30 splendid examples of Greek Women's Costume – several of them never before seen in London, including costumes from Astypalaia in the Dodecanese, fabrics and jewellery from Janina in Epirus and Stefanoviki in Thessaly. It will illustrate the interplay of native tradition and Western aesthetic including the court dress of the first Queen of the independent Greek state.

The Exhibition will run from 4th February – 2nd March and during that time there will be guided tours (your group could even ask for one specifically just for you!!) plus lectures on costume, textiles, the indigenous tradition, history and culture of Greece after independence.

Additionally there will be a fully illustrated catalogue with 10 essays by specialists in the field, with entries and images for each costume – the first major English language publication on traditional women's dress in Greece since Angeliki Hatzimichali's 2 volume survey 'The Greek Folk Costume (1979 – 84), which dear Lillian (Galatis) brought over for us in the group she led then. We could hardly imagine how she managed it they are so big and heavy!

Later on there will be more information which I will pass on from Natassa, but thought some of you might like the advance notice, which I hope will ensure no one interested misses it.

#### Rivieradance! 2014 News

I have some exciting news about what is on offer at Rivieradance! 2014 (Thursday 6th - Tuesday 11th February in Torquay).

Maya Buckley has now joined the 'music team'. She is a very talented and versatile musician, and a most delightful person. We had added a new Balkan instrumental day workshop on Saturday 8th February with Chris Elmes and Maya Buckley, which is open to both resident and non-resident musicians. Participants are invited to stay for the social evening where they will have the opportunity if they wish, to play some tunes for the social dance. The workshop is open to all instruments and will explore rhythm, modal melodies and improvisation in the dance music of the Balkans. Several traditional folk instruments will also be available to try.

We also have a Singing and Dancing course with internationally acclaimed Recording Artist Talitha MacKenzie whose recording of "Changerais-tu?" we often dance to. In her course, you will learn dances from our three teachers (Belco, Kyriakos and Vincent), together with the pronunciation and background of the songs which go with them. And then you will learn to sing the song to the dance with Talitha. Talitha is also preparing a lovely selection of songs for our late afternoon singing sessions, which includes the ever popular Cobankat.

Dancers can opt to do the Singing and Dancing course as well as the main course. This can be an opportunity to get to learn more from a particular teacher if you wish. We are calling this the "singing season ticket". As we have added new information, we have decided to extend the "early bird" prices for the all of the singing course options and these will now be available until December 15th.

There will be an "Introduction to Balkan Drumming" with Marion Nieuwenhuizen (no previous experience necessary!). Maya, Chris and Marion will be available to provide some additional music making opportunities during the week. It may also be possible to work on songs in small groups or individually with talented singer Helena MacGilp.

Our three dance teachers are now preparing their programme for the main dance course. You may not realise this, but some of the dances that we know and love and have learnt from Yves Moreau originate from Belco Stanev (Bulgarian), including Drijanovska Râcenica II, Kucata and Brestaška Râcenica and others. Belco also taught some gems in Swansea back in 1987 (including Opas, Vlaško and Mâdro). He therefore deserves to be 'discovered', and is also highly recommended by Yves, who is planning to invite him to the US and Canada. Anyone who enjoys traditional folkdances and music from the North of Greece will love Kyriakos Moisidis (Greek) and his dance programme. He has spent a lifetime going to the villages in northern Greece and in neighbouring countries where Greeks now live. researching the background to the dances and bringing a wealth of information to us. Finally, I cannot pretend to have had firsthand experience, but people keep telling me that we are just going to love Vincent Parodi (Israeli) and the wonderful dances that he teaches!

The main dance course is designed so that you can do either half days or full days of dancing, and you will get to dance with all three teachers. If you want the freedom to attend any dancing session that you like, then you can select the "both courses" option. I am considering the possibility of adding options for those who wish, to follow the dance courses for one specific teacher. If this would be of interest to you, please let me know.

And finally! our musicians are already busily transcribing music and preparing for the event so that we can enjoy some live music in the evenings. On the Saturday evening we will (hopefully) have visiting musicians playing the music that they have learnt during the workshop day. We are also inviting resident musicians to join a scratch band to play a few tunes during some of the evening social dances. A change for 2014 is that we will have our evening meals earlier so that we can start the social dancing earlier.

Oh! and don't forget the all important award-winning chef at the Livermead House Hotel and the lovely location overlooking the sea. Non-dancing friends and family are welcome and can join guided walks in the area if they wish.

Something that a few of us discovered last time is how helpful it is to travel down a day or two early so you are fully relaxed and ready for the holiday when it starts. It takes the pressure out of worrying about travel delays and weather conditions. You can either have the luxury of staying at the Livermead House hotel at very competitive prices, or you will no doubt find bargain deals with Premier Inn, Travelodge etc if that suits you better. We also discovered that there are lots of rail ticket and National Express deals at that time of year - especially if you book ahead.

I still need more participants in order to cover the costs of having this wealth of Folklore expertise, so do think about supporting this event if you are able to. But note that a lot of single rooms have already been snapped up, so please get in touch immediately if a single room is a must for you.

Sideways, and you go sideways Into the middle and back again Grapevine, another grapevine, And then a cherkessia step on top.


Lining up for fish and chips, Reach up to the counter Right the salt and Left the vinegar
