I am sorry to inform you that Hazel died on 15th October, aged 72, after battling with illness for the last 5 years. Hazel played violin in the SIFD band for many years and really enjoyed the International music. I met her at Staplers English Country Dance Club in Hitchin in 1976 and the following year got some musicians together to play music for the Rainmakers International Folk Dance group. Hazel was in the original line up of Cloudburst. (I wrote an article about Cloudburst in the News in August 2012.)

Over the last 36 years we have had a lot of fun playing together and sharing jokes (Hazel had a good sense of humour). On Monday 21st October it was my turn to call the English dancing at Staplers, where Hazel had been a very keen dancer and Committee member. She danced in demonstrations, played music, was the one who made and put up the decorations for the Staplers' dances, and her cake making, for the interval refreshments, was legendary. I included in my dance programme some dances (Duke of Kent's Waltz, La Bastringue and Picking Up Sticks) using the P10 SIFD recording which Hazel had contributed to. At her funeral, which took place on Monday 28th October, Cloudburst played some of Hazel's favourite music to play her into the church. Hazel was an active member of this Methodist church which she loved. After the service there was dancing and music playing at Hazel's wake. Some members of the SIFD band who were able to get to Barton-le-Clay (it being the day of St. Jude's storm) joined in the music. We felt that Hazel would have approved of the occasion and that she was with us in spirit.

I am afraid that Caroline was mistaken in her response to Bob Macdonald's letter. The musician for the Sunday dances in the early 1950's was Mourie Pfeffer, who was in fact Austrian. Cliff Beck came along to a dance sometime about 1951 on his way home from a YHA weekend and was immediately hooked on both the music and dancing. He purchased a Hoener melodian and started to learn how to to play it, helped a lot by Mourie. Soon they were playing together for dances. Interestingly, neither could read music; both played by ear. Older dancers can recognise a Mourie recording by the "twiddly bits" which he inserted into the tune. Regards,

Apropos the letter from Caroline in reply to Bob Macdonald, it is also quite likely that the accordionist remembered by Bob was Mourie Pfeffer, who often played melodeon at the Inns of Court in the 50s and 60s when I used to dance there. Mourie, I believe, was Jewish, of German or Austrian descent, and he moved to Manchester in the early 70s just before Jean and I moved to Harrogate. We've not heard of him for a few years now, but it is to be hoped that he's still amongst us. Another melodeon player some will remember was Harry Decaux, who used to play for Harrow Green Group around that time. However, we do heartily agree that our old friend Cliff is greatly missed. Thank you, Caroline, for reminding us of old friends from the days of our youth!

Jill Bransby has kindly sent in the following information about Bravade:

Bravade from the Netherlands

Dance reconstructed by Dutch band 'De Perelaar' after a form originally described in Playford, called 'Argeers' (1650). (Cecil Sharp, The English Country Dance Book, Parts 3, p.51.)

Formation: circle of couples with man on the inside, face l.o.d (anticlockwise), hold inside hands. (Can be danced as described below as a mixer dance.)

Figure 1.

A MUSIC Bars

1.2 starting with outside feet (man L and woman R) walk four steps forward

3.4 turn to face partner, hold hands in a 'w' position and do two pas-de-bas steps in l.od. and against l.o.d.

5.6 repeat measure 1-2 of figure 1 again along l.o.d.

7.8 take two hands again and do a 'pancake turn' away from l.o.d.. Finish facing clockwise

9.16 repeat measure 1-8 in opposite direction (clockwise)

Figure 2.

- 3-4 4 gallops away from centre of circle
- 5-8 4 turning polka steps along l.o.d.
- 9.12 repeat measure 1-4 of figure 2
- 13.14 2 turning polka steps in l.o.d.
- 15.16 partners turn away from each other. Woman turns

R. with 4 steps in place, man turns L. and makes a larger circle to end one place backwards in a circle.

Start dance with a new partner.
