Sunday dances in Kennedy hall are too expensive: to cover our costs at current attendance we would need to charge over £20 per person. We are also aware that EFDSS are planning major refurbishment work and will close Kennedy Hall in a year or so to replace the floor and make repairs to the walls and mural. The other hall at Cecil Sharp House is taken by a weekly Tango class.

We have found a hall just a short walk away that has been used and liked by at least one SIFD group. We will hold Sunday Dances there on 12th April and 10th May this Spring and again in the Autumn and into 2016 unless something even better is found. It's a pleasant hall, with a well equipped kitchen, just the right size for us and with heating that should suit the dancers, and the Band!


The 14th June dance will stay in Kennedy as we have an afternoon workshop there and want to make it as easy as possible for people to attend both parts of the day.



News of Teacher Development Courses

At long last!

We are now in a position to start running the long-delayed International Folk Dance Teaching Workshops:

The plan is to run a series of weekend and one day sessions, over a two year cycle.

The course will cover all aspects of teaching folk dance, and is aimed at anyone who wants to work on their teaching and social dance leadership.

For those who wish to do so there will be opportunities for assessments/ observations leading to accreditation as an SIFD teacher - more about this later.

We have had interest from people in many parts of the country and would like to make sure no-one has excessive travel costs, so the course should move around. We must also cover some of the cost, so we propose to charge at the same rate as any other day course.

To get started we need to agree a date and find a venue.

I need to be there as coordinator and will travel as needed. Over the two years we will draw on the expertise of many SIFD (and sometimes external) teachers. Possible dates for the first session are 16th May in London or 23rd or 24th May elsewhere.

The dates are planned to avoid times I cannot be available due to work commitments.

When I first proposed such a course enough people replied to make it worthwhile doing the planning and finding teachers to help run it, now I need your replies to say which dates you could attend, and a volunteer to find and book a meeting place if it is not in London. If you can't do May but are interested in later dates please tell me. (June and July are not possible)

The May session will only run if we have enough people.

I will also find a way to run one or two short sessions at Summer School, possibly directed at MC/ social dance leadership.

Zomerfestival 2015, June 25-28

Last summer I was among those who attended the first Balkan dance Zomerfestival in Zevenhuizen near Rotterdam in The Netherlands. It is running again this year.

It is good value in packing a lot of dance into a long weekend. Although overseas, it is relatively easy to travel to for people living in the east of England via the North Sea ferry so it was somewhat surprising that four only went from the UK last year.

The format is four 1h 15min workshops per day with a choice from 3 parallel sessions (2 dance, 1 singing) in each, with the afternoons repeating the mornings so one could learn every dance if one wants or have revision. The dance teachers planned this year are Bianca de Jong (Bulgarian), Genci Kastrati (Albanian), Caspar Bik (Black Sea) & Dick van der Zwan (Greek). The planned singing teachers are Jan Knoppers & Hedwig Schoots. The evenings are 3 hours of lively join in & follow dancing with the leaders including Eddy Tijssen (Bulgarian) & Turgay Onatli (Turkish). Several of those names will be familiar to dancers in the UK from classes they have lead here individually in the past few years. In the Zomerfestival one can get them all!

It is essentially a revival of the Balkan Festival which ran in Zetten for many years before coming to an end in 2011. For a detailed report of what that was like, see my August 2009 SIFD News article.

The price for the festival is 10 (65 for students under 27) if booked before April 1st. There is a campsite & chalet park nearby with bikes available to hire. Alternatively, if you travel by car, it is close enough to the outskirts of Rotterdam for one to find B&Bs or hotels.

Our folk dance teachers Yves Moreau, France Bourque-Moreau, Cristian Florescu and Sonia Dion are amongst the most sought after in the world, and when you meet them you can see why. They are more than just teachers. Knowledge, energy, enthusiasm and love of folklore just oozes out of their teaching and they are kind, generous friends taking a genuine interest in everyone they meet. Yves has been teaching for nearly 50 years and his method of breaking down a dance makes it seem easy (something we teachers can learn from!). He chooses memorable dances and great music and we probably have more of his dances in our Balkan repertoire than any other teacher's. Running a social dance to suit people from lots of different places (and countries) is always tricky. Thanks to my social dance "helpers" and the enthusiastic participation of the teachers we had a record number of dancers staying right through to the end of the evening and joining in most of the dances. Even the late night singalong on the last night was well attended.

Our teachers enjoyed it so much that they are already talking about coming back in 2017 - so don't miss it next time!

For February 2016 we have much loved Israeli specialist Vincent Parodi, and the delightful International folk dance teacher Roberto Bagnoli. Watch out for more details!
