

## Past Pages - The Beginning

The following letter and article by Frances Brown (née Waight) appeared in the S.I.F.D. News of May 1954

#### **An Historical Note**

(The following article has been received from Frances Brown. In her accompanying letter she says:

"As May 4th is the 10th birthday of the Folk Dance Group at the International Youth Centre, Pont St. Chelsea, from which the S.I.F.D. was developed, I though perhaps that members might be interested to read this account of its beginnings. I wrote this in September '44 to report to other members of the I.Y.C..... Nat came over to England as a 'G.I.' in 1943, and I who am English went to the U.S. for the first time in 1946 when the group blossomed into the S.I.F.D. - so the group was international even in its origin!")

#### Folk Dancing

A notice was posted up at the Centre on Thursday, 4th May, asking any members who would be interested to join a Group of International Folk Dancing the following Sunday, to sign their names. On the Sunday, Nat Brown and I arrived to initiate the enthusiasts, but there were no names on the list! We were prepared for this, however, and had collected a good gathering of our own friends to start the ball rolling. We danced and taught some very gay dances from Scandinavia, Russia and Germany, and before very long people began to trickle in to see what all the fun was about.

The following Sunday we weren't able to take our full team of supporters, but sure enough members came in, in ones and twos, some looking interested, some scared, others slightly scornful, and very soon, although the newcomers said that they couldn't dance, or didn't know our dances, or hadn't the right shoes, the room was filled with couples whirling to our gay tunes. After that, success was assured, and the following week when we asked whether members would like to make the Group a regular Centre activity, there was a unanimous vote that it should be.

The Group has gone on growing, and in spite of summer holidays, the call of the country on sunny Sundays, and the dislocation to daily life caused by flying bombs, we still have a regular Group of about 10 couples who were the first enthusiasts, besides numerous casual visitors, many of whom have caught our enthusiasm and have come to stay.

On Thursday, 29th June, a team of about half a dozen couples, coached only once or twice at our Sunday gatherings, gave a short demonstration for the Centre's Birthday Celebrations. We danced simple couple and group dances from Russia, Scandinavia and Middle Europe and were enthusiastically received by the audience, who joined in the last encore at our invitation. This event brought us new members, and an introduction to John Sampson, who painted the lovely poster which now advertises the Group in the entrance hall.

The Group now has its own collection of records of some of the dances, and we have two pianists to play for us on alternate weeks, one being a member of the Centre - who very nobly filled a breach one week when we were without any music, and now plays our tunes with a most stimulating rhythm and vigour.

We started the Group with dances which Nat had learnt with an International Folk Dance Group in New York, but we hope very much that members will add to our repertoire, dances from their own countries. We have a unique opportunity now to collect more dances, and we shall welcome warmly any member who has any dances to contribute. We also have plans to invite National Groups now in London to dance with us and teach us their dances - they can teach us to dance, even though we may not be able to understand their language. A Hungarian Group has agreed to visit us on November 19th and we hope to welcome many others.

It is doubtful whether a mixed group of, for instance, Scandinavian, German, Czech and English people can really dance the Polish Cracoviak or the Hungarian Mazurka with the same spirit and vigour as they would be danced in Poland and Hungary, especially if taught by an English teacher - but I'm sure we can catch some of the feeling of the dances, especially if we are able to persuade national groups to dance with us and teach us.

Nat and I had two aims in starting the Group - firstly we loved folk dancing and wanted others to enjoy it too, and secondly we felt that much could be done to help the work of the Centre in increasing international understanding, through the social and cultural side of life.

Our efforts so far in teaching the simple dances which we knew have been richly rewarded by the enthusiasm and obvious enjoyment of the group. We have also already experienced much international co-operation and friendship in our small circle of dancers of various national ties, not to mention the co-operation between the New and the Old Worlds in having Nat to help start the group with dances which he had learnt from people of many different countries living in New York.

On reading the above one can see the debt owed, not only to Nat and Frances Brown, but also to those who joined them. Key words are; "enthusiasm and enjoyment"; yes indeed, however what came with many was their 'talents'; not only for dance and music, but administration, teaching, costume making, demonstrations, and a vision for the future by forming The Society for International Folk Dancing.

A national organisation not a club, although in effect that is what it was at the start, but not today. It is indeed a debt of gratitude we owe to them and their successors; too many indeed to name, though without the continuity of that vision, as necessary now as it was then, the SIFD would not be in its seventieth year. It seems that the date of the founding was September 1946.
