

70th Anniversary

Anniversaries are times for looking back and, since becoming a member many years ago, there have been many changes. I am glad the Society is still keeping alive an interest in traditional folkdance from many different countries but regret that the following are no longer part of the Society.

Strong specialist groups - Swedish, Polish, Spanish, Israeli, Estonian, Yugoslav, Bulgarian, French - giving exciting demonstrations in lovely authentic costumes.

SIFD records and books of instruction.

Monthly days of instruction, given by specialist teachers, with emphasis on style.

Badges - bronze for membership, silver and gold for reaching high levels of knowledge of dances and styles, green and gold for recognition as an SIFD teacher - incentives to attain a good authentic standard of dance and learn a little of the background.

SIFD T-shirts, shoe bags, notelets, all with SIFD logos.

Public shows at town halls and other various venues, including "safaris", going from place to place giving short demonstrations in costume, usually in rural settings.

Frequent weekends away, with general international social dancing and walks.

And, of course, the "See How They Dance" shows at the Royal Albert Hall, filling that huge audience capacity for two or three performances.

I know this will be seen as a "Fings Ain't Wot They Used To Be" moan from an elderly member, and probably there is still a lot going on that I'm not aware of, but I'm glad I was part of those old days and I'm thankful for all the pleasure that folkdancing and the SIFD have given me.

The Early Years (1946 to the 1950's)

Last month Frances Brown's article told of the beginning of International dance at the International Youth Centre (IYC). But what of those who danced there and the future? In the turmoil at the end of WWII there were; Poles, Czech's, Jews, Canadians and others as members of the British Forces as well as GI's like Nat Brown, along with refugees living in Britain. It seems that IYC group numbered about twenty regulars plus visitors, and their repertoire of dances was not much greater. Who of that group remained active members for a long period?: Bert Price and his sister Irene Weller (later Fyffe), Jack Richardson and Joan White (later Richardson), David Rosbash, Margery Latham, Mourie Pfeffer, Enid Walters, Mary Butterworth, Irene Prebble, Ruth Sharp (later Coton and now in Australia), Henry Shuster, Charles Fawkes, Ivor Sober, Marie le Fort and Jim Titherage were there. Following soon were Dr. Cyriax, Philip Thornton, Lucile Armstrong, Barbara Duleba and Aili Eistrat. Taken together a wealth of talent!

By 1946 the Sunday dances became a problem for the IYC management and hence the group. The outcome was a formal meeting in July to settle the future, by a narrow majority it was decided to continue and The International Society for Folk Dancing was founded; later when most of the foreign members had returned home, the name was changed at AGM to today's.

The new society needed a hall (Carlyle School was found) for classes; for Sunday dances there was a dingy cellar at a Youth Club in Drury Lane and monthly at Cecil Sharp House. The teachers were Mary Butterworth, Ruth Sharp, Gladys Noble and Irene Prebble. Jack Richardson suggested a class for 'Basic Steps', this proved popular with about fifty members. There was an advanced class, initially by invitation but later open to all who could cope.

Demonstrations were requested and became a regular feature, so costumes were required, at first improvised from blackout material, embroidery and Government surplus clothing and being hired for special occasions. The National teachers provided the incentive for proper costume, and making them gave pleasure. Seeing demonstrations brought more members and groups were formed, a notable one in 1950 at Leytonstone. Harrow Green, founded by Bert Price and Marie le Fort. This soon grew and made a substantial contribution in its own right. Specialist groups helped raise the standard of dancing.

Friends and visitors gave help; Eugene Jablonski from America saw a demonstration at the French Institute, and subsequently gave records of music and taught dances during visits. It was Douglas Kennedy who introduced Dr. Cyriax, Philip Thornton and Lucile Armstrong with others; both he and Mrs. Kennedy came to the Cecil Sharp House dances (she played the drums).

Dances in the repertoire included; The Hambo, Kreutz Koenig, Ras Dwa, Troyak, Swedish Schottishe, Bavarian Landler, Haake Toone, Neapolitan Tarantella, with Estonian and Ukrainian dances, so mainly couple with an emphasis on those of East Europe, but Swedish was popular for demonstrations. The evenings were energetic, lively and vital, all reflecting the spirit of a young organisation suited to the times and providing the interest that has sustained the S.I.F.D. through seventy years.




Great Alne Long Weekend

"Wilf Horrocks' Collection"

Halber Mond (Halb Mond, Halbmond, Half-Moon) belongs to the genre of North German Bunte Taenze (colourful dances) from the Lueneburger Heide. It appears as a 3-couple and 4-couple dance in the American dance literature dating back to Elizabeth Burchenal's 1922 Folk-Dances from Old Homelands. We also have it in Anna Helms and Julius Blasche, Buente Taenze Erstes Buch, 1912 edition, reprinted 1920. The dance has appeared very infrequently among North American recreational international folk dancers, and I will be curious to see how many of your readers recognize it. Anyone wishing a description may contact me directly.
