Manchester

Re-reading my contribution on Manchester in the last issue, I was struck by an incongruity: while the dance description counts 26 bars, the music is only 22 bars long. I went back to re-check with the original and discovered that the dance is 30 bars long. It would appear that the final 4 bars had been lost somewhere in transmission.

The notation fails to show that the last 8 bars should be repeated, thus adding to full length of 30 bar music.

Just in case there are people who would like to dance the Czech version of Manchester, here is the corrected description of the last 8 bars:

Version A for children

23 – 26 Man turns his new partner in right elbow hold 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ times, using double-hop step

27 - 30 With the same new partner left elbow turn 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ times, finish facing each other, man with his back into the circle, and prepare to start again from the beginning

Version B for adults

The polka at the end is danced for full 8 bars (bars 23 - 30), not 4 bars as indicated.

Then it all fits together perfectly!

Čačak Serbian

pronunciation: chah-chahk; from the town of Čačak - means 'dried mud'.

bar 1 R. foot to R. side. L foot across in front of R.

- bars 2 & 3 Repeat bar 1
- bar 4 R. foot to R. side. Hop on R, holding L. foot low in front of R.
- bar 5 Step L. beside R. Hop on L, holding R. in front.
- bar 6 Step R. beside L. Hop on R, holding L. in front.
- bar 7 Step L. to L. side. Step R. behind L. foot.
- bar 8 Step L. to L. side. Hop on L, holding R. in front.
- bar 9 Step R. foot in place. Hop on R, holding L. foot low in front
- bar 10 Step L. to L. side. Step R. behind L. foot.
- bar 11 Step L. to L. side. Hop on L, holding R. in front. Repeat from beginning.





"Wilf Horrocks' Collection"

In Serbia, in the 60's I was told that the steps for **Cacak** (as with many other Serbian dances) could be so small that you could dance them "inside your own opanke". (opanke - Serbian shoe)

Frances Horrocks introduced me to **Cacak**; she referred to it as the dance of 'diminishing returns'. Paja Milic taught a slightly more manic version, and we learnt a Macedonian version from Vlade Janevski in Ohrid.

Next month's offering - **Batrineasca** from Romania - will be known to some of you and you can share your experience with us.
