Folk Dance in Bognor Regis



Every year in our group we take dances from one or two countries and practice them throughout the year with the aim of displaying the (perfected?) dances at local events such as the Southdowns Folk Festival in Bognor Regis. Local Morris and folk dancers give displays around the town, including us: BRIDE (Bognor Regis International Dance Ensemble). In 2013 we danced Greek dances (wearing costumes borrowed from the SIFD); Turkish and Kurdish in 2014; Polish and Hungarian in 2015; mixed international selection in 2016, Spanish, Italian and Portuguese in 2017.

We hoped to show French dances last year, but one of our dancers gave birth (two months premature) to a little girl over the 2018 Festival weekend. Her husband, mother, and aunt are part of the group - so we were more or less wiped out for the first day. The next day a few of us attempted to show some French but after just three dances the rain came.

The weather this year was kinder, we danced our French dances, and several English dances the next day, ending up dancing in the pub. The photo shows our baby in her French costume - but she has to be tied up while we dance; no doubt she will dance with us one day but at present she is confined to 'singing' and clapping.

Moravské Slovácko

Moravské Slovácko, or Moravian Slovakia, is the south-eastern area of Moravia (Moravia is the eastern part of the Czech republic, Bohemia being the western part), bordering on Slovakia to the east and Austria to the south. It is a very distinct folkloristic region, especially as far as music and dance are concerned. The most popular instruments are fiddle and cimbalom. A typical dance is verbunk, dance of recruits, which has even been registered on the list of Masterpieces of the Oral and Intangible Heritage of Humanity by UNESCO. Every year at the end of June, ever since 1946, in a small town of Strážnice is held a popular international folk festival, which is an excellent opportunity to soak up the region's culture.

Moravian Slovakia is known for its colourful folk architecture. Many houses are decorated both outside and inside, with beautiful ornamental patterns on walls and particularly around the doors and windows. And the folk costumes are among the prettiest in the Czech republic. The ladies' ones often use exquisite hand-made lace. The life in the region is further enhanced by excellent locally produced wine and slivovitz.

Dear Janet,

I rarely put pen to paper so to speak, but I did look up the above dance; Although I have not danced it for a while.

I have notes from two sources. Both are as published.

1. Gives a reference to a recording viz: Folk Dancer CMH 1059.

2. From the American published 'Folk Dances of European Countries'

This is dated 1948 so the dance must have been in existence before that date. They translate it as 'Peddler's Pack'.

The instructions are much as has been stated; with one version in longways formation, and the other as a circle and progressive.

Tsone Milo Chedo

I'm here again.

The instructions for the above dance are in the Bulgarian volume of the book series 'Handbooks of European National Dances'.*

* thanks to John for pointing this out - here are the relevant extracts:

Tsone Milo Chedo - (Tsone, dear child)

Region: Zemen, Kyustendil district, and Dimitrovo (formerly Pernik).

Character: Beginning with a moderately quick, easy movement, increasing gradually, decreasing again, to end in a prestissimo.

Formation: For any number of dancers, men and women, one behind the other with hands on hips, facing C-C in a circle. A few dancers begin, and gradually others take their places behind them. Some carry a kerchief which they wave. The rebec player (gadular) stands in the centre of the circle. Towards the end all join hands in a chain, the dance ending in a Horo in very quick tempo accompanied by a song or a drum.

Dance: The 14/16 rhythm is beaten in four, i.e. I-2, I-2, I, I-2, and counted s., s., Q., s. The body is turned slightly (not more than 45°) to the R or to the L in the direction of the swinging foot. The man can take the raised foot behind the other in the Swing step.

Bars

Figure I: Moving forward C-C

- 1 Three hopping steps on l foot, swinging the r knee in front and across to the L, out to the R side and straight forward, to step forward on this foot. (Counted s., s., Q., s., and s. for the step forward)
- 2 Repeat movements of bar 1, but the hops are taken on the r foot, and so on.
- 3-4 Repeat movements of bars 1 and 2.

The man's step is slightly different from the woman's-on the first two hops he swings the r foot across behind the l, so that the r knee faces to the R and the heel to the L.

Figure II: Horo (Chain Dance). Moving C-C.

The joined hands are held about shoulder level, with the elbows bent, and are swung in rhythm.

- Step on r foot to R (s.). Step on l foot in front of r foot, to R (s.).
 Spring on to r foot to R with an inward pivot of the r foot, so that the body faces slightly L (2.).
 Step on 1 foot behind r foot and to R (s.).
- Step on r foot to R (s.). Swing 1 foot across r (s.).
 Spring on to 1 foot with a slight inward pivot of the foot (Q.).
 Step r foot behind 1 foot to L (s.).
- 3 Step on 1 foot to L (s.). Swing r foot across 1 foot (s.). Spring on r foot to R with an inward pivot of this foot (Q.). Step on to 1 foot behind r foot to R (s.).
- Repeat movements of bars 1-3, beginning on bar 4.Repeat whole dance, or Horo only, as often as wished, ending prestissimo.

In this chain dance the dance phrases do not correspond to the musical phrases; therefore begin repeats without reference to the bar number.
