Martenitsas

Every year on 1st March, Bulgarian people celebrate a centuries-old tradition called the day of Baba Marta meaning Grandma March. It signals the finish of winter and welcoming spring.

On that day for a few days afterwards, Bulgarians exchange and wear 'martenitsas'. They are decorative pieces of red and white twisted or woven threads representing health and happiness and a lucky charm against evil spirits.

They can be made from wool, silk or cotton, and come in many shapes and sizes, bracelets, necklaces, brooches, pompoms and balls.

According to the tradition people wear martenits as for a certain period, the end of which is usually associated with the first signs of spring. At the end of the month many martenits as are to be found tied to fruit trees as a lucky charm for a good harvest.

Dance Music of Gascony & South-West France

Emmanuel Pariselle & Didier Oliver: Dance Music Of Gascony and South-West France - Workshop for any instrument.

Saturday 13th. June 10.45 - 4.45 Emmanuel, one of the best melodeon players in France, and an expert in French regional dance music. He also plays a specially-designed 'Franglo' concertina. He has taught at Hands-On Music and regularly leads melodeon-building weeks in England. Didier is a superb fiddler and also dazzles on mandolin, boha (Gascon bagpipes) and guitar. They are favourites at the National Centre for Folk Arts at Halsway Manor. Both are wonderful singers.

Using traditional dance material from Gascony collected in the 1970s & 1980s, the workshop will be based on the three legendary dances of South-West France: the Rondeau (couple & chain) the B'arn Chain Branle and the Captieux Congo. Emmanuel demonstrates harmonies with melodeon and Didier demonstrates melody & style with other instruments. 

There is a very interesting day costume with which they would be acceptable. A friend and I once chased a lady wearing a day costume and eventually she gave us a day top which we could copy. It had a plain black hat, a striped black top, sleeves lined with green and a plain black full length skirt and the infamous klompen.

I hate to be picky but we are particular about costumes from other regions whereas the costumes from the Netherlands have been plaguarised. Many are very beautiful and I have thoroughly enjoyed the 20 years I have spent working with them. My 5 authentic costumes and my klompen have just found a home in the Holland Christian Homes in Brampton, Ontario a Seniors home with 6 large buildings housing older Holland born residents.

Nobody has presented any information about **Enbenet Reel** - so I did some research about it:

Enbenet means 'one-legged' in Danish. I suppose that fits with the feeling in the leg after some Danish dances (2 counts on the left foot and only one on the right).

Enbenet is also used in Denmark to describe the gait of the intoxicated.

The third Enbenet is the name of a type of wading bird / heron type.



It seems we are losing some of the Society's early dances. Next month **Vivat Szocs** from Poland will feature - has it also been lost?
