Makavitza Ukraine

A cake-dance of Russian Ukraine and adjacent countries, at village feasts; harvest festival, or at a rich wedding. This 'dance of cakes' is performed by a ring of twelve unmarried girls; each one carries a piece of cake (made of flour and honey, and flavoured with poppy-seed) which she is required to bite, with the rhythm of the dance.

Mejorana Panama

A traditional dance, probably of Spanish origin. In square dance form, with partners facing each other, *zapateado* steps are used and the *paseo* or promenade.

Five -stringed guitars (Mejorana) take their name from the dance which they accompany. There are many traditional mejorana airs, sung during the dance, the melody being in 2/4 time with an accompaniment in 6/8 time. Usually in the major key, when it is played in the minor key its name is changed to **Gallino**. The **Mejorana-Poncho** is a slower version. (below: Mejorana)





Uplifting lifts

The item on Lift in the August SIFD News brought some nice memories of my youthful dancing. As a member of the university folk dancing group in Prague I became quite adept at performing a lift. I suppose I was lucky that my usual dancing partner was a slim, nifty girl. I don't remember how successful I was with the other female partners in the group.

Lift (zvedačka) is part of several Czech and Moravian dances, often just an optional embellishment for display at the end of the dance. Good co-ordination between partners is essential, and to my mind, especially the ladies have the harder part and have to be quite brave. For a man it needs just some muscles to help his partner to shoot up. She lands, kneeling and supporting herself on arms, on the man's shoulders. I always admired her trust in the partner's reliability and stability. The ladies' folk costumes, comprising usually of dozen or so underskirts, at that moment completely wrapped round man's face and prevented any meaningful orientation. Thus, spinning his partner kneeling on top, ended for the man in some dancing displays with facing the backstage scenery, rather than the audience. A nifty correction was then needed.

Those are sweet memories of an old man. Nowadays, I'd probably suffer backache if I'd try to lift a feather pillow over my head.


