"As we celebrate the 90th anniversary of the Felpham & Middleton Country Dance Club, we cannot help but reflect on the role that our club has played in some of the most significant events in modern history. During World War II, many of our members answered the call to serve their country One of the most remarkable stories of our club's involvement in the war effort is the role that our dancers played in the D-Day landings On June 6, 1944, as Allied forces stormed the beaches of Normandy, a group of our dancers were among the first to land on French soil. They were part of a secret operation to set up a dance hall on the beach, where soldiers could go to relax and unwind after the gruelling battle. This dance hall became a beacon of hope and joy for the troops, and it played a vital role in boosting morale during the early days of the invasion. After the successful D-Day landingsmany were involved in the capture of Paris, as Allied forces liberated the city they danced in the streets of Paris, Our members also played a key role in the Battle of the Bulge and were among the troops who were airlifted into the battle zone to provide support and assistance to the soldiers on the front lines. They set up dance halls and entertainment venues in makeshift buildings, providing a much-needed respite from the rigours of combat. and spirit of our members. Even in the midst of war, they never forgot the joy and happiness that dancing can bring, and they found ways to share that joy with others."

Incredibly, until the early 90's the News was produced by a team of dedicated members, each working to a tight schedule every month to pass on their bit to the next member in the chain. Michael and Edwina were members of the chain and were made honorary members of the Society in appreciation.

At its most active the Society:

Ran day-courses every month with teachers from abroad. Ran weekend courses, staying at lovely houses; Well, not <u>all</u> lovely; Surrey Crest had wooden huts and bunk beds! Week-long Summer Schools at university premises.

Trips abroad to collect dances, music, costumes.

Demonstrations at various venues, inside and outside.

Took part in International Eisteddfod and Billingham Festival

And, of course, our shows given at the Royal Albert Hall, (Friday evening, Saturday afternoon and evening) Sunday dances at Cecil Sharp House.

We also used to promote the SIFD by producing illustrated postcards, notelets, T-shirts, shoe bags, tea-towels and books and music.

There are probably still lots of groups, demonstrations and classes going on at the moment that, as I am no longer an active member, I don't know about, so it would be good if members contributed to the SIFD News by sending in an article from time to time, and as a past editor I know how difficult it can be to fill the pages so I'm sure Janet would be pleased to have more material. Also, resuscitating the "The Chairman Writes" and "Secretary's Notes" would be a good idea so that we can hear what the Committee is working on or planning.
