Aulona Interfolk Festival, Vlora, Albania

I am planning to take a group to this festival in 2024 in the coastal town of Vlora in southern Albania. The stay in Vlora would be for five nights from 23rd May and leaving on 28th May. The tour would start from Corfu and take a ferry across to Saranda and then involve a drive along the spectacular coast road to Vlora or alternatively arrival could be by plane to the Albanian capital Tirana with a transfer from there. During the festival there will be some Albanian dance lessons in the mornings, but also some outings with the folk dance groups performing in the festival, such as to the beach along the coast and a visit to the Zvernec monastery in the lagoon of Narta, a haven for many birds. On the last night of the festival our group can perform an Albanian dance on stage in Albanian costumes. On the return journey to Saranda we can travel by the inland route via the UNESCO World Heritage city of Gjirokaster, the best preserved Ottoman town in the Balkans.

The festival organiser has offered to arrange transport to and from Saranda or Tirana, excursions in Vlora area, 4 star hotel accommodation and meals for 650 Euros. The ferry/flying dolphin crossing between Corfu and Saranda would cost about 40 Euros.

We are sad to report the death of Richard Thom, who will have been known to many folk dancers for many years as the broker for the SIFD group insurance scheme. He was on a bird-watching holiday in Australia when he had an accident and went to hospital for a back injury, while he was there it was discovered he was already suffering from a kind of cancer. He was treated for that and flew home but on the flight his health became worse and he died on 16th October, from multiple causes.

He did English and International folk dance. At the Rainmakers international folk dance group in Letchworth, he enjoyed the Israeli circle dances but his preference was the couple dances, in particular Renningen, which as many readers of SIFD news will know is a Swedish weaving dance with a string of figures ending with a kind of procession. It calls for exactly 16 people, some of whom have specific roles in some of the figures, but Rainmakers was a big group in the 1980s and 90s and we danced it quite a lot.

If anybody wants to make a donation in his memory, his niece's suggestion is to the RSPB. The funeral directors are Austins Funeral Directors Stevenage; the funeral was on 28th November.
