
For myself, I loved learning dances from Fiona - she was a truly memorable teacher.



Further to our recent notice in S.I.F.D. News about our weekend of Dance 2nd and 3rd March, with Mariette Van Gelder, there is a change to the advertised Saturday venue.

Our usual venue at Bramcote Memorial Hall is now no longer available to us on Saturday March 2nd.

The workshop, supper and evening dance will now be held at **Stapleford Community Hall**, Cliffe Hill Avenue, Stapleford NG9 7HD. The hall is accessed from the public car park Cliffe Hill Avenue, off Toton Lane, Stapleford.

If looking at Google maps the hall may come up as Baby Sparks Sensory (Maycliffe Hall has been demolished and is now a small block of flats). This is just a class held in the hall during the week.

The car park is a long stay car park costing £1 for 12 hours which will be reimbursed if you have a day ticket or weekend ticket. There are electric car charging points in the car park.

Fiona Howarth


Members throughout the society will be saddened to learn of the death of **Fiona Howarth**. An outstanding dancer and inspirational teacher, her influence has been enormous and will, no doubt, be enduring.

Fiona's teaching was justly famed and inimitable. I am privileged to have been in many of Fiona's classes, beginning as an eight-year-old in Mrs. Howarth's dance club. Day courses, summer schools, I've followed her feet in all of these. Still, I find it hard to identify exactly how she was so astonishingly effective.

She was totally prepared, unfailingly clear and sharply observant, of course, but she was more than all of these. Fiona had an extraordinary talent for making dances memorable. Her classes were events. She conducted a workshop with the sense of theatre and the panache of a conjuror. You came away not only feeling you had acquired the spirit of the dance but also thinking, "How did she do that!" One group recently danced a collection of 'Fiona Dances' in tribute to all they'd learnt from her. They found they were identifying all the dances, not by name, but by the ingenious mnemonics that Fiona had invented to make them memorable. Job done, then!

But I think there's even more to it than all of this. Fiona was committed to communicating the dance and the essence of the dance and she was utterly generous with the material. For all the excitement and entertainment of her classes, she never failed, ultimately, to stand to one side and make the dances themselves the focus. This is why I am so sure that her legacy will be a lasting one. I have learnt so much from Fiona. She has been my teacher and my friend and her spirit will always be dancing.



Learning village dances

For the last 25 years I have travelled extensively, especially through Greece, Armenia, Turkey and central Asia, Nepal and India learning and studying village culture and dance. Nothing is so thrilling, moving, and heart-warming as these traditional and sometimes really ancient dances. After all, if a dance has survived two thousand years it must be really special. The dances often have stories, rituals or specific celebrations or customs associated with them. Dancing with village people is incredible. People who have danced their dances all their lives, who live and breathe their dance in everyday life. Frequently I have been welcomed with open arms into these dance circles by people with whom I have no language in common but we have spoken through our common love of dance.

What I have learnt goes far beyond dance or steps or even music. I have learnt about survival, tenacity, perseverance, patience, love, respect, generosity, gratitude, joy, humour, honouring the earth, honouring our ancestors, loss, death, growth, friendship..... the gifts have just been endless.


Slowly I began to take others with me on these trips to dance with local teachers and villagers and with ever increasing numbers groups have travelled with me to Istanbul, Bursa, Cappadocia, South East Turkey, Corfu, Pelion, to the Roma people in Turkish Thrace, Armenia (several times) and Black Sea Turkey. Everything of course came to a halt at the beginning of 2020 and all plans for future trips had to be cancelled.

Now that we are able to travel again, I am very excited to be able to invite others to join me on two new trips to Georgia and Azerbaijan in September 2024 and to Village India in 2025. Both of these trips have involved a huge amount of planning and organisation but I have local people who I know I can rely on who will take good care of us and offer us some amazing experiences. Sometimes these trips involve a small amount of discomfort, maybe some days with long journeys and plumbing that isn't always like ours in the UK.

They are maybe not 'holidays' in the conventional sense of the world but adventures into traditional dance and culture. The main criteria to really get the most out of these travels is an open heart, a smile and a willingness to laugh when things don't go as planned. These journeys only happen once, they are too special to attempt to repeat them.

Sunday Afternoon SIFD Dances in London



Please put the dates in your diary and hopefully as it is in the afternoon more people will be encouraged to travel into I ondon.



"Wilf Horrocks' Collection"




Having looked on the internet I believe I have danced the **Bourrée Pastourelle** (not knowing its name) at French Bals in the south of England. It was followable, here follows a rough notation:

Couples in a circle: The bourrée step is danced throughout.

All circle. Men and ladies alternate into the centre and back. Grand chain. do-si-do partners then counter partners. Men twirl successive ladies on one place. Repeat men and ladies alternate into the centre and back.


