I am pleased to give you final details of the course and information about the College and travel to Swansea.

The course will begin with tea at 16-30 on Saturday, July 25 and the first class will be at 17-45 on that day. Dinner will be at 19.45 and then there will be a Social Dance. On Sunday to Friday, inclusive, there will be two classes each morning and a third class before dinner. The afternoons will be free for excursions to the nearby countryside and beaches, and coaches will be provided. There will be a Social Dance each evening and, in addition film shows and a Costume Exhibition will be held. On one afternoon there will be an extended outing and no evening class. The course terminates after breakfast on Saturday, August 1.

CLASSES As previously announced, there will be three streams running in parallel:

Standard Specialist
Fast Specialist
General

You are asked to confirm which stream you will be following. Please note that the numbers on the course are high and participants must stick with their selected stream and not switch between streams. For instance, it will not be possible to attend both the standard and the fast classes of any given country.

The Standard and Fast Specialist streams will each consist of 6 Bulgarian, 6 Sardinian and 6 Norwegian classes during the week. The General class will include a wide repertoire of dances taught by Rod Perkins, with some classes taught by specialist teachers.

COSTUMES It is proposed to arrange an exhibition of costumes. If you have a costume yourself, would you please bring it to wear at the final dance, and possibly for display in the exhibition. If your Group has authentic costumes available would you ask whether they would be willing to lend them for the exhibition.

OPEN FORUM It has been suggested that we should take advantage of the presence of so many members to hold an Open Forum where matters of general interest and Society policy could be discussed. Please indicate whether you support this proposal and the topics you would like discussed so that appropriate background material can be prepared. The Forum would be open to members and non-members.

ACCOMMODATION Participants will be housed in Neuadd Lewis Jones in which all bedrooms now have wash handbasins. On each floor, there is a small kitchen and tea, coffee and powdered milk will be provided. You may find it advantageous to bring additional coathangers and a cup. There are 13A electric sockets and shaver points in each bedroom. Please note that the telephones for outgoing calls are all Cardphones and you are advised to bring a card with you. Incoming calls are received only in the porter's room (0792 205678 Ext 4653). In emergency, during working hours, messages may be left on 0792 295194, 295196, 295197 (try in that order!) Further details of the Hall are given in the yellow leaflet (Ignore meal times: bus station telephone now 475511: College House now Fulton House).

A limited amount of accommodation is available for participants who wish to come on the Friday evening, when an informal dance may be arranged if there are sufficient numbers. Accommodation is also available for Saturday night (August 1). There may be some recording and video-recording sessions on the Saturday. In addition, it is likely that accommodation will be available on a bed and breakfast basis for the week following the course.

SPORTS FACILITIES The Sports Centre and the Swimming bath are available for Conference members for limited periods, admission 20P (details on arrival)

FINAL REGISTRATION I shall be pleased if you will kindly return the enclosed Registration form, together with outstanding fees, as soon as possible, and not later than July 15. Please indicate any special requirements on the form (diet, accommodation, etc) even if you have notified me previously. The fee for residents is all-inclusive and covers accommodation, breakfast, morning coffee, lunch, dinner, excursions, and such music and instructions as are available from the teachers. The non-residents' fee covers all these items with the exception of accommodation, breakfast, lunch and dinner: however, they may book lunch and dinner on a day-to-day basis. Resident non-participants may take part in all activities with the exception of the classes.
