"No child should have to witness their parent dancing." mused Hugh Laurie* intending, of course, to be engagingly self-deprecating but depressingly expressing the 21st century zeitgeist. There's no doubt that social dancing has undergone a sea change since the days of our grandparents' generation when learning to dance was part of growing up.
