What does the traditional dance scene look like when it's just emerging from a pandemic? Of course, compared to the grief and suffering that Covid has wrought in families throughout this country and the world, missing out on social dancing has been a very small price to pay. There's no doubt, however, that we have never needed the joy and connectedness of dancing together more than we do now. Throughout the

periods of restrictions, dance continued to play its central role of connecting people. Dance teachers and performers, who had never heard of 'zoom' two and a half years ago, heroically brought the spirit of dance to the isolating and the locked-down in bedrooms and kitchens all over the country. These dauntless movers and shakers organised classes and workshops in outdoor spaces when weather permitted and, sometimes, when it didn't! This spring **Dance Around The World Festival** is dedicated to all those people who have facilitated dance in the most difficult of circumstances. 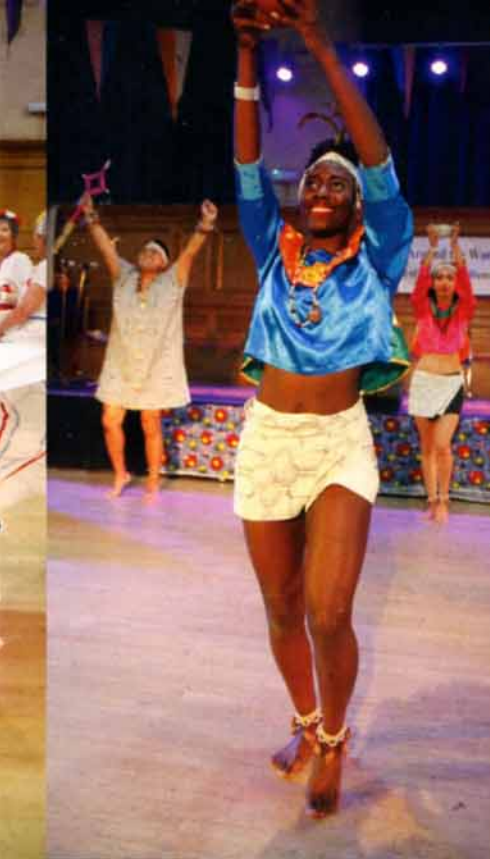
